In the name of God Amen. I Galley Davis bring Health in
body but of sound mind and desposing memory do ordain the follow
ing to be my last Will and testament.

I give and bequeath the negro child Lewis and my Clock to my
Brother Thomas Edwards.

2. I give and bequeath to the children of my sister Elizabeth
Dunn all the ballance of my estate both real and personal, with
the following Conditions; that the negroes shall not be carried to a
distance against their will, but shall be sold in the neighbour
hood, and that my clothes shall be divided amongst the
daughters of my said sister Elizabeth if they can be conveyed
to them - if not, they shall not be sold but divided amongst the
children of my Brother Thomas Edwards. I nominate my
Brother Thomas Edwards, and appoint him the Executor of this
my last Will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and affixed my seal this third day of April

county. To all to whom these presents shall come come greeting:

Know ye, that on the third day of March in the year of our Lord eighteen
hundred and twenty eight the last will and testament of Sally Davis late
of said County deceased, was proved, and approved, and allowed of; the said
Sally Davis having in her life time, and at the time of her death, divers
goods, rights, and Credits of said deceased, and her testament, any manner
or way concerning, to the end part of which belongs:

within the County aforesaid; by means whereof, the approbation and allowing of her said testament, and the power of granting the administration of all and singular the goods, rights and credits of said deceased, and her Testament, any manner or way concerning, to the said court does of right belong: They have therefore granted and committed the administration of all and singular, the estate aforesaid and her Testament unto Thomas Edwards nominated Executor of the said deceased in her said last Will and testament, being first sworn on the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God, will and faithfully to administer and make a perfect inventory of all and singular the goods, chattles, and credits of the said deceased, and exhibit the same into the Clerks office of the Court of Ordinary's office in the County aforesaid, in order to be recorded, on or before the third day of June next ensuing, and to render a just and true account, calculation, and reckoning thereof when thereunto required.

In testimony Whereof, I have officially set my hand and seal this third day of March eighteen hundred and twenty eight and the 52nd year of American Independence.

William Sumner Battle's Will.

I William Sumner Battle of the State of Georgia, and the County of Taliaferro, do make and ordain this my last Will and testament in manner and form following (viz)

First I lend unto my beloved wife Sarah Battle, dwelling house and all the out houses, and the plantation wherein I now live, with all and singular the premises and appurtenances thereto belonging or appertaining, during her natural life. Also I lend her twenty negroes to wit, Chaney, Anne, Emely & Weston, Lewis & Sinney, Bobb & house Harriett, Green, Jane, Bradford, Bow, and Martin, Phillips & her sister Harriett, Samuel, Ezekiel, Cynthia, Kitchen & Dick and their increase during her natural life. And I give and bequeath unto her all the house-hold and kitchen furniture. I give her all Stock of horses, cattle, hogs and sheep, and all the farming utensils, Blacksmith tools, carpenter-tools, Wagons carts & gear of every kind, and the still and all the casks, and all the bread, corn, fodder, wheat oats and barley. Also give and bequeath unto her all my ready money, my outstanding debts and dues, and request that the five small debts may be paid out of it.
