1<sup>st</sup> Item, I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and  
Christian like manner suitable to my Circumstances and Condition in life

My Soul I trust shall return to rest with God, who gave it;

2<sup>nd</sup> Item, I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay, by  
my Executors herein after appointed as I am unwilling my Creditors should be  
delayed in their rights, especially as there is no Necessity for delay

3<sup>rd</sup> Item, I give and bequeath to my Nephew Samuel Johnson son of my Bro.  
Tilas M. Johnson of Newton County Ga, after he the said Samuel Johnson  
shall have paid over to his Sister Catharine Reynolds, the sum of Five hundred  
dollars) Nine Negroes, twit, Peter a man about 53. or 54 years of age; Peter  
wife Lettuce about 59 years of age and their five Children viz Elizabeth  
Harriet, Elvinda, Lydia, & Mary, and Anna and Sarah Jane - Grandchildren  
of the said Peter & Lettuce together with an increase of the issue of the said  
Negroes

4<sup>th</sup> Item I give and bequeath to my Nephew Tilas M. Johnson the proceeds of the  
Sale of my Negro man Dick about 46 years of age known as my Blacksmith  
My Executors to sell him privately giving him the privilege of choosing his own  
purchaser, and my Negro woman Jenny about 48 years of age I also give and  
devise to my said Nephew Tilas M. Johnson all of my Washington County lands  
and also the tract of land which I purchased of A. J. Lightfoot, known as the  
Jackson place; I also give and bequeath to Samuel Johnson son of my said  
Nephew Tilas M. Johnson one thousand dollars, to be paid over to him when my  
estate is settled up

5<sup>th</sup> Item, I give and bequeath to my Nephew William P. Johnson my Negroe  
woman Lucy 69 years of age, and Elijah a man about 39 years of age. I  
also give and bequeath to Samuel Johnson son of the said William P. Johnson  
my Negro boy Simon about 15 years of age, he the said Samuel to have possession  
of the said Simon, when he arrives at the age of 21 years up to that time to  
belong to his Father William P. Johnson

6<sup>th</sup> Item, I give and bequeath to Samuel J. Moore son of my deceased sister  
Elvinda H. W. Moore my Negroe woman Adaline about 32 years of age

and her two Children named Dallas & William together with all inclusive of the issue of the said Adaline wishing them to be kept together or if sold, sold together and to have the privilege of choosing a purchaser.

9<sup>th</sup> Item - I give and bequeath to Newton Humphrey the proceeds of the sale of my Negro woman Lucy about 41 years of age the said Lucy to be sold by my Executors with the privilege of choosing a purchaser.

10<sup>th</sup> Item - I give and bequeath & devise to Samuel A. Howell the other half of the tract of land known as the Parker place, as directed by himself and myself.

11<sup>th</sup> Item - I give & bequeath to my Nephew William Samuel Johnson son of my deceased Bro John Johnson, one thousand dollars. I also give and bequeath to my Nephew John F. Johnson, son of my said deceased Bro John Johnson Five hundred dollars, and I also give & bequeath to my niece Mary Ann Armstrong daughter of my dec<sup>d</sup> Bro aforsaid Five hundred dollars each amount to be paid over to them when my estate is settled up.

12<sup>th</sup> Item - I give and bequeath to my niece Almira Howell one thousand dollars and to Mary Jane Moore Five hundred dollars each amts to be paid over to them when my estate is settled up.

13<sup>th</sup> Item - I give and bequeath to my Niece Narcisa Humphrey daughter of my bro Ashfield Johnson Five hundred dollars, and to Samuel Atkinson son of my Cousin Mary Atkinson I also give Five hundred dollars, each to be paid over when my estate is settled up.

14<sup>th</sup> Item - The residue of my property both real and personal whenever and whatever it may be after my Executors shall have paid over and settled up as before directed. I give bequeath & devise to my six Brothers & Sisters, to wit, Bro Elias M. Johnson, William Johnson, Ashfield Johnson, and his wife Hannah Parker, Susan Slaughter, and Elizabeth Bain each of whom to have and equal portion of all my lands in Taliaferro County Ga except the portion willed to Elias M. Johnson and Samuel A. Howell, the lands to be sold by my executors and the following Negroes, to be sold in like manner and with the privilege of choosing their own purchasers, to wit, my Negro woman Lucy and her eleven Children & Harry and her eight children exclusive of one willed to Samuel J. Moore.

15<sup>th</sup> Item I hereby constitute and appoint my Nephew Samuel Johnson, Samuel A. Howell and William W. Moore Executors of this my last will & Testament and desire that they shall be compensated for their services.  
This March 19<sup>th</sup> 1858.

Bird of the County of Taliaferro and State of Georgia being of feeble health but of sound mind and disposing memory do make declare and publish this to be my last will and testament hereby revoking all others heretofore made by me. Item 1<sup>st</sup> It is my will and desire that out of the Money Notes and Accounts and other evidences of debts of which I may die provided all of my just debts should be first paid Item 2<sup>nd</sup> I will and bequeath to my wife Martha Bird the house and lot whereon I now live and all my house-hold and kitchen furniture on said lot and provisions for one year which bequest is intended in lieu of dower, and if she claims dower I wish the house & lot herein will be sold and divided between my children share and share alike; I also give and bequeath unto my said wife one fifth part of all my other personal property of every kind and description.

Item 3<sup>rd</sup> It is my will and desire that all the balance of my property both real and personal be equally divided into four parts - One of these parts I give to my son George Bird - one of these parts I give to my son Buford E. Bird - one of these parts I give to my Brother Philemon Bird in trust for the sole and separate use of my daughter Catharine Bird during her natural life free from the Marital rights of any man with whom she may intermarry and after her death in further trust to her children and in case she shall die without leaving issue living at the time of her death to divide said property among my children living at the time of her death and the representatives
