

*Sellers Testamentary of Thomas L. Morris dec'd.
Georgia Taliaferro County.*

By the Honorable the Court of Ordinary for said County.

It is all to Whom these presents may Come — Greeting:
Know ye, that on the fourth day of July in the year of our Lord
Eighteen hundred and Twenty nine, the Last Will and Testament
of Thomas L. Morris late of said County deceased, was proved, and
approved, and allowed of, the said Thomas L. Morris deceased, having
in his life time, and at the time of his death, divers goods, rights, and
Credits, within the County aforesaid, by means whereof, the approbation
and allowing of the said Testament, and the power of granting the
Administration of all and singular the goods, rights, and cred-
its of said deceased, and his Testament, any manner or way Con-
cerning, to the said Court does of right belong. They have, therefore
granted and Committed the administration of all and singular
the estate aforesaid, and his Testament unto Rachel Morris,
(who was duly Qualified in open Court, at November Term 1829,
as the only one) nominated Executrix, of the said deceased, in his
Last Will and testament, she being first sworn on the holy
Evangelist of Almighty God, will and faithfully, to administer,
and make a perfect inventory of all and singular the goods,
Chattles, and Credits of the said deceased, and exhibit the same in to the
Clerk of the Court of Ordinary's office, in the County aforesaid, in
order to be recorded, on or before the second day of February next
ensuing, and to render a just and true account, Calculation and
reckoning thereof, when thereunto required. Witness the Honorable
Archibald Graham one of the Justices of said Court,
In Testimony whereof, I have officially set my hand and seal
this second day of November Eighteen hundred and Twenty nine,
And fifty fourth year of American Independence.
