Valdosta County } I Thomas L. Morris of the County and State aforesaid, considering the shortness of this mortal life, and being weak in body, yet of sound mind and disposing memory, do make, ordain and publish this my last will and Testament.
Item 1. My will and desire is that all my Just debts be paid. Item 2. I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Rachel Morris Thirty acres of land it being the portion which fell to her share in the division of her Father's estate. Alas two Negroes (Viz) Burrel and aggey, One bed and furniture, my Black horse, One moiety of Stock of Cattle and hogs, one moiety of my house-hold and Kitchen furniture, and my farming utensils to be hers without division.
Item 3. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Missouri Ann Morris Four negroes (Viz) Charity and her infant child, and her other two children (Viz) and all and future increase, One bed and furniture, the remaining moiety of my stock of cattle and hogs, house hold and Kitchen furniture, and my sorrel horse if it is not thought best to sell him for the payment of my debts.

Item 4. It is my desire and will that the supply on hand of corn fodder, and bacon (or as much as may be necessary) remain undivided for the Mutual Support of my family.

Item 5. It is my wish and will that all and singular ~~the~~ the property and effects not herein particularly enumerated be applied to the mutual Benefit of my wife & child.

Item 6. Providence nevertheless. If my wife Rachel Morris should be pregnant, and should bring forth a posthumous Child or children, It is my will and desire that all my property in the above Items be thrown into what is call'd hotch potch and an equal division made between my wife Rachel & my daughter Missouri Ann, and such ~~forth~~ posthumous Child or Children, if any.

Item 7. It is my will and desire that my Brother Simon Morris take the guardianship of the property of ~~the~~ ^{my} daughter Missouri Ann, and I do hereby Constitute and appoint him to the management of the same.

Item 8. And Lastly it is my will and desire that my beloved Wife Rachel Morris, be the Executrix of this my last Will and testament, with discretionary power to sell any part of my stock or chattles which she may think can be best spared for the payment of my Just debts, And I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannull, all former wills, or legacies by me made, & ratify and Confirm this as my last Will and desire.
