

William Jones (Will) 31

State of Georgia } In the name of God Amen.—
Taliaferrro County } I William Jones of the County and State above
Written being of sound mind, and memory, do hereby make and Ordain
this my last will and testament (Viz).—

In first. I do hereby give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Selekah Jones
during her natural life the following property (viz) all that tract
of land wherein I now live known as the Lawson Tract, thirty nine acres
adjoining the above land formerly belonging to Littleberry Little; and eleven
acres of the Harrison tract of land adjoining the above lands making
in the whole Two Hundred acres be it the same more or less, also
Sixty dollars such as the my said wife may choose out of the negroes
I may die possessed of; Three choice horses and four wheeled carriage,
Four choice Cows and Calves, Thirty Choice hoggs, Ten choice sheep, one
choice yoke of oxen, one cart, Two choice beds, Bedsteads and furniture and
so much of the house hold and kitchen furniture, as the my said wife
may designate for her use, also fifteen hundred Dollars in money
a sufficiency of farming tools in proportion to the land and
negroes given her and provisions (viz) Corn and Bacon to last her and
her family one year, I do also will that all the Balance of my Bed
and bed furniture not heretofore given my wife to be left in her
possession and use, provided that she shall be under obligation to
give to each of my children that may become of age (they not having
previously received any household furniture) one bed, bedstead and
furniture estimated to be worth forty dollars to be accounted for by
each child so receiving it in the settlement of my estate.

The before mentioned property both and real and personal as herein
expressed to be my said wife's during her life, and at her death to be
equally divided share and share alike between all my children.

Item 2nd I have heretofore given to each of my following named Chil-
dren (Viz) Thomas Q. Jones, Abraam Jones, Susannah Ballouey formerly
Susannah Jones, Elizabeth Gibson formerly Elizabeth Jones, Edward Jones,
Archibald Q. Jones, William Jones Junius, and Lovicia Moore,
formerly Lovicia Jones, in Money and property to the amount as per
schedule in my account book, of property and money given my before
mentioned Children.

Item 3rd It is my will and desire that to my other Children (Viz)
Simeon R. Jones, Seleah Q. Jones, David H. Jones and Mary Ann Jones

Jones, shall be given property and money in the same proportion

as designated in the accounts of my first named Children.
Item 4th It is my will and desire that the real estate that I may die possessed of (excepting that heretofore designated and bequeathed to my wife during her life) to remain in the hands of my executors to be sold or as sold the whole or any part thereof, or rented, at the end of which time, if my executors have not previously in their discretion sold any part or the whole of my said real estate; they shall then proceed to sell it at such times, on such credits, and in such parcels as they may deem most advisable for the benefit of my children; the proceeds to be disposed of by them as heretofore or hereinafter directed.

Item 5th It is my will and desire that all my personal property with the exception of the negroes, and that herein before bequeathed to my wife to be sold by my executors in such manner as they may deem most advisable and the proceeds of such sales, together with the proceeds of all such sales large the balance of my estate, not heretofore and herein disposed of to be equally divided there and there alike between all my children.

Item 6th Provided that if anyone of my before mentioned several minor children should die without heirs during their minority it is my will and desire that whatever of property or money might belong to them that it should be equally divided between my children or their heirs.

Item 7th I do hereby constitute and appoint my sons Thomas G. Jones, Absalom Jones and Archibald G. Jones, my executors to this my last Will and testament.

In witness whereof that that is contained and written on the preceding pages is my last will and testament. I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 16th day of March 1827.
