I William Maddox of Georgia and County of Taliaferro
after serious reflection in my own mind have thought fit
and proper to make this my last will and Testament and
that in usual state of health and of sound mind and
disposing memory I have thought proper to divide my
worldly goods in the following manner

Item 1st It is my will and desire that all my Estate both real
and personal Consisting of Lands, Negroes, Stock, Household
and Kitchen Furniture plantation tools and all the Crop
that is growing or shall be on hand at My death, shall
be kept together by my dear wife Anna Maddox, and owned
by her during her natural life and not to be troubled
or taken away by any person or persons during that
period in any shape, manner or way whatever, Only it
is my wish will and desire that my son James Maddox shall
have and may have the management of the plantation and
Negroes for my wife Anna Maddox all her business done
by him and he the said James Maddox shall have all
the profits and incomes arising from said Estate after my
wife support from and after my death until the end of one
year after the death of my wife Anna Maddox as a compen-
sation for his trouble of taking care of his mother and seeing
to her business as his own right and property, and at the
expiration of one year after the death of my wife Anna
Maddox it is my will and desire that all my property and
Estate then shall be divided as follows

Item 2nd For the good will and affection I bear towards my son
John Maddox I give into the hands of James S. Maddox for
said John Maddox ~~the land and negro support~~ one tract
of land lying in Taliaferro County Wills 18264866 Davis tract

one negro man by the name of Lewis, at the death of said John Maddox the Land and negro above described to be the property of James S. Maddox to Compensate him for his trouble Further I give said John Maddox one bed, bedstead and furniture to manage as he pleases

Item 3rd For the good will I bear towards my daughter Polly Gibson
* I give to her one negro man by the name of Mingo and twenty five dollars in Cash -

Item 4th For the good will and affection I have towards my grand son William Maddox the son of Leonard Maddox I give to him the sum of ten dollars

Item 5th For the good will and affection I bear towards the heirs of Benjamin Maddox dec. I give to each of them the sum of Ten dollars

Item 6th To the wife of Leonard Maddox dec. Polly Turner I give the sum of ten dollars

Item 7th For the good will I bear towards my son James S. Maddox I give and bequeath the land whereon I now live, at the death of my wife Anna Maddox to him the said James S. Maddox

Item 8th To my two sons James S. and Jesse Maddox I give and bequeath the balance of my property both real and personal not otherwise disposed of in this my last will and Testament

And I do hereby constitute and appoint my two sons James S. and Jesse Maddox my lawful Executors to execute this my last will and Testament revoking all former will and Testaments by me at any time heretofore made, and have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this second day of October in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and thirty two (the word death interlined before signed)

 Taliaferro County } I John Rogers of said County
 being afflicted in body, but of sound and disposing
 memory do make and ordain this my last will and testament hereby
 revoking all other wills by me at any time heretofore made as follows
 Item 1st I give to my son in law William Park a tract of land, two
 Negroes (viz) Amy & Sam and other property heretofore
 received
 Item 2nd I give to my son in law Samuel R. Ransom one fourth
 part of my Negro property counting those he has already
 received after the payment of my just debts
 Item 3rd It is my wish that the rest of my property after
 paying my just debts, to be kept together by my beloved
 wife, and used by her for the support of my family and
 education of my sons untill my son Thomas Rogers arrives
 to the age of twentyone years when it is my will that
 my Negroes, and other personal property Executors give
 them off one third of the remainder of my Negroes and
 other ^{personal} property. And when my son John Rogers
 arrives to the age of twentyone years it is my wish
 he should have ^{one} ~~half~~ ^{one} ~~half~~ of my estate on
