I William Sumner Battle of the State of Georgia and the County of Taliabero, do make and ordain this my last Will and testament in manner and form following, viz:

First I lend unto my beloved wife Sarah Battle, dwelling house and all the out houses, and the plantation wherein I now live, with all and singular the premises and appurtenances thereto belonging or appertaining, during her natural life. Also I lend her twenty negroes to wit, Charney, Anne, Emely, Weston, Lewis & Linney, Bob & house Harriett, Green, Jane, Crawford, Bow, and Martin, Phillis & her sister Harriett, Samuel, Ezekiel, Cynthia Kinchen & Dick and their increase during her natural life. And I give and bequeath unto her all the house-hold and kitchen furniture. I give her all Stocke of horses, cattle, hogs and sheep, and all the farminag utensils, Blacksmith tools, Carpenter-tools, Waggon Carts & gear of every kinds, and the still and all the casks, and all the bread, corn, fodder, wheat oats and barley. Also give and bequeath unto her all my ready money, my outstanding debts and dues, and require that the same be paid at the time, and be laid out of Taliaferro County Wills 1826-1866

the decease of my wife, my will and desire is, that all the
personally property that may remain of my estate, and does not
otherwise appropriated, be equally divided amongst my
