

Will of Dr. Wm. J. Peck

In the name of God amen

William J. Peck of the State of Georgia and County of Taliaferro
being of sound mind and disposing memory do make Ordain and
publish this my last Will and testament touching such property

I may die propeled of hereby revoking disannulling and declaring
all & void all other wills heretofore made by me. —

In First — I wish all my just debts and funeral expense paid out of

such monies as may be on hand at my death

In Second — To my beloved brother Richard D. L. Peck I give and
bequeath two Negroes, to wit, Jone a man about twenty five years
of age and Ebenezer a boy about twenty years of age — I also
give and bequeath to my said brother Richard D. L. Peck all
my money after paying my debts and funeral expences and
all my notes, bonds, Speciatties, accounts, dues of all kinds and
all evidences of debt, that may be found on hand upon my
death — He is to pay my debts and funeral expences out of
them either out of the money or other effects aforesaid as
he pleases and all the balance of said monies Notes bonds
Speciatties accounts and dues are to be his absolutely

In Third, — All the rest and residue of my property both real
personal, lands, Negroes, plantation tools, Cattle, hogs, horses,
and Stock of all kinds & description I give and bequeath unto
my beloved brother Felix Peck. — But in Case my said Brother
Felix Should die leaving no Children or grand Children living
at the time of his death then I bequeath the property in
item or Clause of my will left to him to my said brother R.
D. L. Peck if in life and if not then to such of his Children
their descendants as may at that time be in life — His son
take per Stirpes if any of his Children living at the
time of my said brother Felix without issue of his own living
at the time of his death as aforesaid If my said brother Felix
leaves issue living at his death then the property in this
left to him I will & bequeath to such issue to take per

Fourth — To the following named Negroes, to wit, Mary Ann &
two Children Napoleon and Eugenia, Rachael & her son
Elizabeth a girl and Hall a boy have been good truly
faithful servants to me it is my wish and desire that

that the families should be kept together. — And it is my wish
and desire that my brother Felix, to whom I give them shall treat them
kindly and see that they are as comfortably provided for as their con-
dition in life and their conduct and behaviour will justify; I wish
him to treat them just as he may at all times think I would treat
if I was in life. — This confidence I repose in him with the full
assurance that it is not misplaced and that it will not be abused.

Item Fourth — I Nominate Appoint and Constitute my brother Richard
D. L. Peck the Executor of this my last will & testament

this twenty second day of April 1857.

Codicil

In Case my brother Felix should at any time wish to sell the tripple
tree one of my plantations I give him full power to do so and in that
event it is to be his absolute and I wish him to give Thomas Peck the
refusal of it at six Dollars per acre — There are about two hundred and
fifteen acres in it. — I also hereby Nominate Thomas Peck executor
for this will to act with my brother Richard D. L. Peck — 27th Apr. 1857.

Know ye that on the sixth day of October in the year of
our Lord one thousand eight hundred and Sixty, the last will and Testament
of Dr. William J. Peck late of Taliaferro County deceased was exhibited in
open Court and in Common Form of law, proved and admitted to record, a
copy of which is hereunto annexed, and administration of all and singular
the Goods, Chattels and Credits of said deceased was granted to Richard D. L.
Peck & Thomas J. Peck the executors in and by said Will named and appointed
they having first taken the Oath, and performed all other requisites required
by law they are by Order of said Court, and by virtue of these presents legally
authorized to administer the Goods, Chattels and Credits of said deceased, accord-
ing to the tenor and effect of the said Will and Testament, and according
to law; and they are hereby required to render a true and perfect inventory
of all and singular the Goods, Chattels and Credits of the said deceased, and
appraised and returned to this Court according to law, and to render a true
and correct account to the said Court of their actions and doings, and
yearly and every year, until their administration is fully completed.
