give to Isaac Veazey Son of Ezekiel Veazey, my son fifty dollars  
for his part of my estate, The Balance of my Property I wish  
to be equally divided, Between my children at the death of my  
Wife Nancy Veazey. I hereby appoint my son Jesse Veazey my son  
Executor of this my last Will and testament hereby Revoking all  
Former Wills by me made in Witness whereof I have here unto set  
my hand and Seal this 20<sup>th</sup> December 1826.
