end of said thousand acre tract running a straight line
from the shore of the river to the outside line with all the
rights members and appurtenances thereto belonging
or in anywise appertaining to the same the above
mentioned tract or parcels of land free from all
charge or limitation future or to come proper or not

profit and behoof forever with full power to dispose of
the same at any time previous or by will or deed at his
death as he may think proper

3rd Item I give and bequeath and desire to my daughter
Catharine four hundred acres of land to be taken off
of a one thousand acre tract granted to W. M. Coleman on
the 25th day of November 1851 lying and being in the
County of Tattnall and State of Georgia Warrant dated 1st
day of January 1861 and surveyed the 25th day of October
1861 bounded by Charles Harris and vacant land six
four hundred acres of land to be taken off of the lower
end of said one thousand acre tract with all the rights
members and appurtenances thereto belonging and
of land in anywise appertaining free from all charge or
limitation whatever to her or her proper heirs her gift and
behoof forever with full power to dispose of the same
at any time previous or by will or deed at her
death as she may think proper

4th Item I give hereafter and desire to my daughter Margaret
Elizabeth wife of Henry Lytle four hundred acres of
land being the remainder of the Charles Harris thousand
acre tract after giving to Catharine and my son Jer-
emiah and four hundred to my daughter Catharine
said four hundred acres of land which I give to my daughter
Margaret is to be the middle portion of said one thousand
acre tract with all the rights members and appurtenances

the said four hundred acres of land in August, belonging
to the same free from all charge or limitation whatever
To her own personal benefit and behoof forever
And full power to dispose of the same at any time
Previous or by and in will at her death if she or her
Heirs should so desire.

11th Item) I give by gift and devise to my dear friend
A tract of land containing four hundred and
six and a half acres with all the rights, liberties and
appurtenances thereunto belonging a said tract
of land forever retaining the right to my wife
Henny, during her life time the privilege of
taking said timber off of said tract, said tract to be
known by difference to a plat of the same lying
for the hundred acres granted to Mrs. W. Coleman dated
30th day of November 1831 and 1st day of October 1835
Grant dated 10th January 1835 granted by lands
of Tattnall and Grant at the time of survey free from
all charge whatever with full power to dispose of
the same at any time previous or by will or devise
at her death if she may think proper.
