die & make their last will & Testament in manner and  
form as follows

Item 1<sup>st</sup> I give and bequeath to my beloved wife to have my negro man the  
most boy Albert our father left behind after his death as much other of household

supply of provisions. this above named property I give to my wife for her support  
during her natural life and after her death it is my will that it shall be divided two  
processes equally divided between my children or my grand children in the  
event any of my own children should die before such time & distributed to his place

Item 2<sup>nd</sup> I give to my loving wife the sum of my negro boy for

Item 3<sup>rd</sup> to my son Thomas & give my negro girl Martha

Item 4<sup>th</sup> to my daughter Sarah & give my negro girl Eliza

Item 5<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my son William Wilson my negro girl Nancy

Item 6<sup>th</sup> to my son Neal Wilson I give and bequeath my negro man Jim

Item 7<sup>th</sup> To my son William Wilson I will in trust for the use and benefit of my daughter  
Sarah - negro Maria Murphy and of her by another name to manage said  
property in the same manner that may come into his hands as he may think  
best for most convenience to her benefit and in the event my said daughter  
Sarah should die before her 21<sup>st</sup> birthday or natural age it is my will that my son  
William act as their guardian during three months by.

Item 8<sup>th</sup> To the event any of the girls I have children should have any income  
it is my desire that all such incomes be left and equally divided between  
my daughters. It being my desire that said children share equally in  
the division of my estate. and knowing that some of the negroes left behind  
valuable than others it is my desire after my death that each negro be valued by  
disinterested persons and any amount in excess be paid to last of my children  
or may have negroes of less value to make them equal to those most valuable

Item 9<sup>th</sup> It is my will that all other property that I may die possessed of  
and not aforesaid be sold and the proceeds after making my children  
equal in the sum of the negroes left behind to them and pay to each of my  
daughters fifty dollars to make them equal with my sons addition  
may remain being equally divided between my two children  
the one destined first to the sum of my daughter Nancy hundred  
to my son Neal - and if there is money for her to distribute I leave the same

I do hereby nominate & appoint my sons Thomas and William Wilson  
Executors to this my last will and testament.
