 family that I should make a disposition of the
 property with which a kind Providence has
 blessed me. I then give make this my last will and
 Testament hereby revoking and annulling all
 others heretofore made by me.

Item 1st I desire and direct that my body be
 buried in a decent and Christian like
 manner suitable to my circumstances &
 condition. My soul I trust shall return to
 rest with God who gave it as I hope for eternal
 salvation through the blessed Lord and
 Saviour Jesus Christ whose religion
 I have professed and as I humbly trust
 enjoyed for many years.

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Item 2nd I direct that all my
 just debts be paid without delay by my executor
 here in after named as I am unwilling my
 Creditors should be delayed of their rights
 especially as there is no necessity for delay.
 Item 3rd I give and devise to my beloved wife
 Harriet W. Livingston and my daughter
 Delilah B. Livingston four Lots of Land lying
 in the 8th District of W. Lefair County Ga
 Nos 250, 251, 265 and 267) Amount Two hundred
 and fifty Two hundred and fifty one Two hundred
 and Sixty five and two hundred Sixty
 Seven Containing in all Eight Hundred
 and ten acres with all the rights, tenures
 and appurtenances to said Lots of Land
 in any wise appertaining or belonging
 free from all charge or limitation
 what ever to their own proper use
 except and except during their
 lifetime. I also give and bequeath

to my wife and Daughter Harriet W R and
 Delilah A Livingston The farming utensils
 belonging to said plantation of every description
 whatever and all so two horses and all of
 my stock of cotton and sheep and hogs also
 my corn fodder and other produce on the
 plantation and also my Household and
 kitchen furniture during their natural lifetime
 them 4th of the said Delilah A Livingston
 should marry then she is where in her own
 right Lot of Land Number Two hundred and
 Sixty seven and such portion of the
 personal property as my son William W -
 Livingston shall designate

them 5th In case of the death of my wife Harriet
 W R Livingston or the death or Marriage
 of my daughter Delilah A Livingston
 then all of said property real and personal
 shall go to my son William W Livingston
 except what ~~may~~ be willed to my daughter
 Delilah A Livingston in their fourth
 them 6th

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I give and bequeath to my son
 Richard Livingston Lot of Land No
 two hundred and Sixty Six in the South
 West of said County - G W.

I have heretofore given my daughter Mary
 W Carmichael and my sons Abraham H
 and John A Livingston their portion
 of my Land Stock & Cattle of my Estate
 them Seventh

I give and bequeath to my daughter
 Martha C Brumby one year of corn
 and to my daughter Eliza Jane Brumby forty
 dollars to be paid to Richard C Livingston
 as her share of the profits of corn not sold
 in his previous sales and to my daughter
 Eliza Jane Brumby one year of corn

Item Eight. I constitute and appoint
 My sons William W. and John A. Livingston
 Executors to this my last will and Testament
 This January the 11th 1869.
