Oct. 7th 1881

In the name of God Amen.
I James Williamson, being old & subject to die
and desiring to arrange all my business
in a Christian manner do make this my
last will and Testament revoking all other
wills or parts of wills whether verbal or written
and having given all my children a good
English education and several hundred dollars
worth of property consisting of cattle land
and horses & the amount of money I now have five
hundred dollars each and now having made
any bequest directly or indirectly from any
of my children and others being well able
to support them along with the exception of my
grand son James W. Harrell who is deaf and
deformed and being unable to work I give
at my death one half of my property of every kind
for his own use and benefit forever

- 1st I give to my son James W. Williamson one hundred dollars at my death, provided my effects will reach that amount
- 2nd I appoint my daughter Margaret A. Harrell my executrix to carry this my last will and Testament into effect. This October 7th 1881
