 personal during his widowhood until my two

 are of age at which time here shall be an
 equal division between me and all my children
 then living and the said Mercy being permitted
 from time to time to assist as far as concerning
 to any of the said children that they leave
 her in the shape of a loan and at the
 maturity of the said youngest children the whole
 shall be collected and equally divided between
