

Last Will of Benjamin Kemp

State of Georgia of Benjamin Kemp of the State and County of Mitchell County do hereby knowing the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death do make this my last will and testament

1st I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my trustee hereinafter appointed

2nd I give and bequeath to Oliver Thompson & John Colquhoun Minors some of Benjamin Colquhoun deceased lot of land viz two hundred and eight in the eighteenth district of New Webster County that do in Consideration of things thus sold in my hands all being gone into Confederate Money and the same made and sold by my trustee to make the same better to said Oliver and John the amount of the same at the age of twenty-one years by their giving the said trustee a receipt in full of all demands or Claims for my estate otherwise the said lands to Conveyance to my estate

3rd I hereby transfer and bequeath to the estate of John Colquhoun deceased lot of land number eighty-nine (89) and one hundred and four more both being except ten acres in the South East Corner of sec. 16th being in the eighteenth district of New Webster County and direct my trustee to make better according on the basis of said John Colquhoun giving my trustee full receipt for all Claims on me or my estate therefor

4th I give and bequeath to Mary Frances Colquhoun One Thousand Dollars to be paid out of my estate at such times and in such manner as may be most agreeable to her and my wife Fanny Kemp and direct my trustee to do to the paying of the same and if she Mary F should die without
