Item First. I give and devise that all my joint estate be paid out
and sold by my Executors herein after named

Item Second. I give and devise that my property be kept together
for the mutual benefit of my wife and children so long as my wife
remains single in case my wife should marry I desire and direct
that my property should be equally divided between her and my
children

Item Third. I give and devise that my Executors herein after named
shall have power to sell the place whereon I now live if they should
deem it best for the benefit of my wife and children and to make
a good and sufficient title to the same, and to buy another place
for them, as they may deem right and proper for the benefit of my
wife and children and to sell any other property I have and buy again
as they may think right and proper

Item Fourth. I appoint my beloved wife Susan and my worthy
brother James H. Loring guardians for my children.

Item Fifth. I constitute my beloved wife Susan Executor and my
worthy brother James H. Loring and my trust friend Mr. C. Stephens
Executors to this my last will and Testament this June 12th 1861
