

being in the name of God Amen
I, Samuel County, S. Thomas, of the State of Tennessee
and County of Wilson, being of sound mind and perfect memory
and knowing that I must shortly depart this life, do hereby
express that as respects me, I do hereby, and myself that I should make
a disposition of the property which is at this time in my hands
to make this my last will and Testament, to be in full
of all other last wills and Testaments by me.

First Item I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent
and Christian like manner suitable to my circumstances and con-
dition in life, my soul I trust shall return to rest with God and
give it, as I hope for eternal salvation through the merits and
attonement of the blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

Second Item I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid
without delay by my executors herein after appointed and I am
willing that my creditors should be delayed in their rights espe-
cially as there is no cause or necessity of delay.

Third Item I give bequeath and direct to my sons Samuel and
John Smith Wynne my homestead farm which I have
situated in the Third District of Wilson County State of Tennessee with
all the rights, members and appurtenances to said tract in any
wise belonging, free from all charge or limitation whatever to them
and their heirs forever and I give and direct that they should have
of the same at any time previous to or by will or deed at their death
by their own choice to do, each with his interest.

Fourth Item I also give and bequeath to my son James H. my
negro boy, Sterling in the same manner as above.

Fifth Item I also give and bequeath to my son John my negro
boy, Michael in the same manner as above and I also
give to my son John the gray horse to which he lays claim.

Sixth Item I hereby constitute and appoint my son James the
guardian of the person and property of my said minor son John.

Seventh Item I give and bequeath to my son William H. my
negro boy, my horse and farm in the 2nd District of Wilson County Ten-
nessee, situated on the old road leading from Nashville to Lebanon
with all the rights, members and appurtenances to said lot of land in any
wise appurtenances or belonging to me.

Eighth Item I also give and bequeath to my son William my
Cedar tract of Land in Wilson County Tennessee adjoining the land
of Reed and Davis in the same manner as above.

Ninth Item I give and bequeath to my son William my negro
man, Wash, age about 20 years and Mary about 22 years of age
and her three children viz. Bet aged about 15, Callen about 10
and her infant not yet named to have forever. I hereby appoint
my son James Wynne the guardian of the person and property of my
said minor son William.

Tenth Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary the
negro boy, my negro man, Peter aged about 20 years.

aged about twenty eight, free and about thirty four and five of her
children viz. Henry about 24, Sam about 18, Fannie about 15, Kate about 9,
and her infant not yet named, to her and to the heirs of her body forever.
The inheritance of the said Negro to be subject to the disposal of her
husband W. W. Blair at any time during his life, and at his
death on his any child surviving, said negroes, Peter, Matilda, Lucy
Henry, Sam, Fannie, Kate and Lucy infant in her womb the income
I give and bequeath to my daughter Martha Blair or Blair wife
of William W. Blair, and all her children free from the disposition
of her present or any future husband forever.

Eleventh Item. I do give and bequeath to Martha Blair Blair
wife of William W. Blair, my Slave Peter to her and to the heirs of her
body forever and I appoint and constitute W. W. Blair husband of
Martha Blair or Blair sister of the said Peter, her executor and trustee
to my daughter Martha Blair or Blair and all her children.

And if the Peter. I do give and bequeath to my daughter Lucy Ann
Ely Wynne, my Negro woman I named about 24 years of age
and her four children viz. Peter about 5 years old, Emily about 3,
Eli about two years of age and her infant not yet named, Alice
Will about two years of age, Sarah about 12, Fannie about six years
old, about four to her and the heirs of her body forever. The income
of said Negro to be subject to the disposal of her husband in case
of marriage at any time during his life by will or by act, at his death
and if he should be intestate to be subject to the terms of administration
for the benefit of his children by the said Lucy A. E. Wynne, said
Negro viz. Amanda, Peter, Emily, Eli and her infant not yet named
Will, Sarah, Fannie and Lucy in her womb the income I give and bequeath
to my daughter Lucy A. E. Wynne free from the disposition of any
husband she may hereafter have, and I appoint William W. Blair an
executor of the power and property of my said minor daughter Lucy
A. E. Wynne.

Twelfth Item. The residue of my personal property viz. stock
of all kinds & farming utensils Carriage, Household and Kitchen
Furniture to be sold by my Executor as it may best suit their con-
venience; and the proceeds thereof to be applied to the payment of my
debts, if more than enough to pay my debts, & divide the balance
to be equally divided between my four children, (viz.) Martha, Fannie, Henry
Lucy and William in the same manner as aforesaid,
and if the proceeds of my personal property be not enough to pay
my debts, I desire an equal share out of each legacy &c on the
payment thereof.

Thirteenth Item. I desire that my faithful old servant Fannie
may have the privilege of choosing a home with either of the heirs
of my Estate, requesting that the one with whom she may feel
disposed to live shall take good care of her.

Fourteenth Item. I desire that such stone or tablet to my beloved
Henry and Consolation in life be erected near the graves of Mother
and my beloved wife Elizabeth Wynne,

Thirteenth I have I hereby constitute and appoint my friend and
Almoner & Wym, and my much valued friend and business John
Long my Executor of this my last will and Testament this 24th day
1861

bearing witness that I must shortly depart this life I do hereby make a dispo-
sition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me, I do
thereby make this my last will and Testament hereby revoking and
annulling all others by me heretofore made.

First I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and a
Christian like manner, suitable to my circumstances and condition
in life. My soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it and
I hope for a safe passage through the merits and atonement of the blessed
Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

Secondly I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid with-
out delay by my Executor herein after named and appointed.

Thirdly It is my will and desire that my executor shall as soon
after my death as far as possible cause to be sold to some good
and honest person my negro slaves herein after named, to wit
Lemina and her children, Tom, Edmund, Frank, and Aaron and
proceed immediately to distribute the money arising from the sale
thereof as herein after directed.

Fourthly It is my wish and desire, and I hereby give & bequeath
unto my beloved sister Mary Ann Thompson the entire and undivided
part of all the money arising from the sale of my negro named
negro slaves and I do hereby direct my executor to pay the same
over to her or her legal representative as soon as he can effect
a sale and receive the money suffering nothing that can be
to occasion any delay whatever.

Fifthly The remaining two thirds of the money arising from the sale
