Archibald McIntyre Esq.

Archibald McIntyre of Cowards County,  
late of Twiggs County being sick in body but sound in mind  
do make my will as follows viz

I give to my beloved wife Harriet during her natural  
life a sum money viz William and Elizabeth, John, Archibald, Joe  
Will and Alice and I also give demise and bequeath  
unto her during her natural life a tract of land back or  
lots of Land number one Hundred and thirty eight and  
one hundred and thirty nine thereon thirty chains or a hundred  
and thirty eight rods and twenty five or in a hundred and  
fifty nine each to extend through each tract or lot of Land  
I give to my beloved son Archibald McIntyre Slave negroes  
of Henry, Judas and Miller And give to my beloved daughter  
to Catharine, Myckie, Gilly and Charly having giving them to  
her before I am sur for the little to her and also give the Charly  
I give to my beloved daughter June in consideration of her  
expectation of having her hands burned a negro girl Etty re-  
lax after that be upon a festing of the rest and draw  
and share with the rest and all the balance of the negroes  
that a rest named above be left in common stock with the  
rest of my property except my lands until the oldest one of  
my four youngest children come of age then let the court appoint  
comind assessors to value and make an equal distribution and  
then let him take his slaves and then the balance return back
