Thomas County, Bryan (Plenty) of the
County and State aforesaid being
in a low state of health of body but
in my sound mind and senses do
make the following my last will &
testament. In the first place I give
and bequeath to my wife Louisiana
Bryan one sorrel mare and gig, one bed
and furniture and ~~one~~ ^{one hundred and fifty}
dollars in cash I give to my daughter
Elizabeth Subanna Bryan one Carver
Cherry bedstead bed & furniture and a
set of silver spoons
I give & bequeath to my daughter Lavinia
Will Elmines Bryan the following
slaves viz Leah a woman about twenty
one years Mary a girl about two
years old & a man or man about twenty
three years of age
I do give and bequeath to my daughter
Lavinia Henrietta Bryan the follow-
ing slaves Denis a man about two
and eight years Hagar a girl abo-
ut ~~eight~~ ^{eight} years old
I give and bequeath the following
slaves to my daughter Angeline
Bryan viz Patience a woman
about ~~thirty~~ ^{thirty two} years old
and a girl child about seven years
old and Mary a woman about
forty five years and one set of silver

ten spoons

I also give and bequeath to my son Lucy Coffe Bryan the following slaves viz Dave a man about twenty eight years Diem a woman about about twenty three years, Lane a girl about 1 eight or nine months old and my gold watch should it ever be found.

and it is my order and request that all the remainder of my property be sold to pay my debts and after all my debts shall have been paid the remainder of the money (if any) to be equally divided among and between my wife & children and I do further order and request that John Coffe and Peter Coffe of Jefferson County and Harely Bryan of Thomas County shall be executors of this my last will & Testament to see that all things shall be done according
