

Sary Sary, and her child Sarah, and my negro girl Henry, together with all their increase from this date.

Item third - I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Susan, two hundred such as she may choose from all my horses, twenty head of stock cattle, twenty head of stock sheep, twenty head of stock hogs, two such as she may choose from all my hives together with all furniture belonging to said hives, all without reserve or limitation.

Item fourth - All the rest of my property both real and personal when and whenever it may be except a negro boy hereafter disposed of I give and bequeath to my son-in-law John Walden to him and his heirs forever.

Item fifth - It will be seen by "Item fourth" that I have given all my lands to my son-in-law John Walden, but it is my will and wish that my beloved wife Susan, and my son-in-law John Walden and his family, should live together in my house at my present residence, and cultivate together the land known as my plantation, but should any of them become dissatisfied and prefer to live separate, then and in that event it is my will that my Executor shall purchase for my beloved wife Susan such a place as they may think suitable to her wants and circumstances in life, and said place shall be paid for by my son-in-law John Walden, and shall belong to my beloved wife Susan for and during her widowhood only, at the expiration of which time said place shall become the property of my son-in-law John Walden, to him and his heirs forever.

Item sixth - All the property which I have given and bequeathed "Item second" to my beloved wife Susan "for and during her life"; at her death I give and bequeath to my son-in-law John Walden, to him and his heirs forever.

Item seventh - I give and bequeath to my grand child John Walden, son of my son-in-law John Walden, and my daughter Mary, a certain negro boy by the name of Jim, to him and his heirs forever.

Item eighth - I constitute and appoint my beloved wife Susan Executrix, and my son-in-law John Walden Executor to my last Will and Testament this sixteenth day of April 1844.
