

Will of Mundock McKeim

Thomas County 3. I know all men by their presents, that I Mundock McKeim of the State and County aforesaid, being weak in body but of sound disposing mind and memory and knowing the uncertainty of life but the certainty of death, do make constitute and ordain, and by these

present do make constitute and ordain this as my last will and Testament, which is as follows viz—

1st— It is my wish and desire that my beloved wife Ann McKimmon should have the use and control of all property both real and personal that I may be possessed of at the time of my death (Subject to the payment of my debts) for her own maintenance and for the maintenance of my children who may remain with her during her natural life or widowhood.

2nd— It is my wish that immediately after the death of my wife Ann McKimmon, that all my property both real and personal be divided among my heirs according to the laws in force in Georgia at this time.
