ration in order to fulfill the
provision made by the acts of Congress
of the 15th March 1816

I have not since that time by gift
or sale or in any manner disposed
my property or any part thereof
with intent thereby to diminish
it as to bring myself
within the provisions of an act of
Congress entitled an act to provide
for certain persons engaged in
the land and naval service of the
united States in the revolutionary
war passed on the 10th day of
march 1810 and that I have not
since that time by gift nor has
any person in trust for me any pro-
perty or securities contracts or de-
bts to me nor have I any incum-
brance than what is contained in
the schedule hereto annexed and
by me subscribed

Schedule of property
That the following property was
275 Acres of pine land in N. C.
Carolina worth 3000 \$ Three head
of horses worth 100 \$ Small stock
cattle worth 50 \$ Stock of hogs
worth about fifty dollars was
all the property that I owned
on the 10th march 1810 except
necessary bedding clothing and a few
misc tools &c &c

I Archibald McIntyre of Swains County
late of Tripp County being sick in body but sound in mind
do make my Will as follows viz

I give to my beloved wife Margaret during her natural
life a negro viz William and his son, John, Cindy, Sam
Will and Alex and also give demise and bequeath
unto her during her natural life a part of two tracts or
lots of land numbering one Hundred and thirty eight and
one hundred and thirty nine thence thirty claims or a hundred
and thirty eight and thirty nine or in a hundred and
thirty nine each to extend through each tract or lot of land
I give to my beloved son Daniel McIntyre three negroes
viz Henry, Jude and Alex And give to my beloved daughter
Catherine, Mary, Gilly and Charly having given them to
her before I was confined the title to her and also give the Char-
ly. I give to my beloved daughter Jane in consideration of her
nuptials of having her hand married to a negro girl Eliza and
her after that be upon a portion of the rest and dower
and have with the rest and all the balance of the negroes
that is not named above be kept in common with the
rest of my property except my lands until the eldest one of
my four youngest children comes of age then let the court appoint
commissioners to value and make an equal distribution and
let him take his share and then the balance return back
