

Abner Turner's Will.

Georgia

Troup County: Know all men by these presents that Abner Turner of the County and State aforesaid, smitten of the weakness and shortness of life; of perfect free Will and in the full enjoyment of all my Mental and rational faculties do make certain and publish this to be my last Will and Testament.

Article 1st I desire that all my honored debts and contracts shall be first paid out of my Estate.

Article 2nd For the love and affection which I have for my Aunt Mrs. Francis Warren, I give and bequeath unto her the Sum of Five Hundred Dollars.

Article 3rd For the love and affection which I have for my Cousin Mrs. Sarah Hardiman, I give and bequeath unto her the Sum of Five Hundred Dollars.

Article 4th For the love and affection which I have for my Cousin Mary Warren daughter of Abner Francis Warren, I give and bequeath unto her the Sum of Five Hundred Dollars.

Article 5th For the love and affection I have for my Aunt, Elizabeth Rogers, I give and bequeath unto her the Sum of One Hundred Dollars.

Article 6th For the love and affection which I have for my Brother Thomas W. Turner, I give and bequeath unto him in fee simple all the residue and remainder of my Estate both real and personal, after the payment of the afore mentioned Legacies. And do hereby make, Ordain, Constitute and appoint my said Brother Thomas W. Turner my residuary Legatee and as such to have the hold and to enjoy in manner and form aforesaid all and every of my property and Estate which has not been herein disposed of.

Article 7th Reposing special Confidence and trust in my friends John Warren of the County of Putnam and John C. Morgan of the County of Troup, I do hereby nominate and appoint them my true and lawful Executors to carry into effect according to the spirit and meaning thereof, this my last will and Testament; and desire that they shall discharge the Legacies herein bequeathed to some as convenient after my death.

This my last Will and Testament made, Signed, Sealed and Published this Twenty sixth day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty. (Turner)
