

The Last Will and Testament of
Andrew Hendon dec'd

Georgia I, Andrew Hendon
Troup County } being weak in body
but sound in mind and memory and
knowing that all men must die I
do therefore make this my last will
and testament,
1st I will that all my just debts
be paid and if necessary for that
purpose that there be sufficient
of my effects that can be best
sold by my Executors
leaving that matter discretionary
with them and they are hereby em-
powered to do that without legal
expense.

2nd And it is further my will that
the remainder of my Estate be left
to my wife Margarett during her
life time or widowhood with the
exception of a reasonable portion
that she may give off to my chil-
dren as each of them may come of
age or marry having an eye to
an equal division in the end - and
in case my wife should intermarry
she shall have a certain negro woman
named Easter during her natural
life and at her death said negro
is to be sold and equally divided
between my legal heirs -
3rd And in case my wife Margarett
should intermarry that my Executors
appropriate the remainder of my Estate
to the benefit of my children except

One page and by the name of Caroline
which my daughter Sarah is to take
at a fair valuation to be assigned of
by three disinterested men or a portion
of her distributive share of my estate
And I do, further empower my Executor
to use their discretion in selling the
land that I now live on and leaving
having a place suitable for my
family which all is to be done
without going into legal Expenses
4th And it is further my will that
my wife Margarette Hudson and
Gillum Hogan be and are hereby
appointed my Executor to carry out
my last will and testament into effect
