

The Last Will and Testament of Anthony Holloway

Troup County Wills, Book B,

1848/1888

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Now the name of God amen, I Anthony Holloway of the State of Georgia and County of Troup being in common or full use of body and a perfect state of mind and memory and calling to mind the certainty of death and the uncertainty of life do make this my last Will and Testament as follows

- Item 1st It is my Will and desire that all my just debts shall be paid out of such of my property as my Executors shall think most proper not otherwise beguathed
- Item 2^d I give to my wife Lilpla Holloway all the property that she owned previous to our intermarriage together
- Item 3^d She further taken of my love and for the kindness of my wife Lilpla Holloway to me I lend to her all my land and plantation also a negro girl named Indigo and a horse team such as she may choose out of my stock of horses also one third part of my household and kitchen furniture such as she may choose at the appraisement during her natural life or widowhood for her support
- Item 4th I give to my grand children Helen Holloway, Rufus Holloway, Rebecca Holloway, Ephrus Holloway, Katherine Holloway and Anthony Holloway the children of my son Allen Holloway deceased one negro man named Perry and after the death or marriage of my wife Lilpla Holloway I give to my six grand children named in this item all my land that I own to my wife and that to be their distribution share of my estate
- Item 5th It is my Will and desire that all the Residue of my property not given away nor hereafter given nor loaned, be sold and out of the money arising from said sale, I give to my four grand children William M. Williamson, Reuben S. Williams, Martha Williamson and Elizabeth Ann Williamson one hundred dollars each and the balance of the money arising from said sale to be equally divided betwixt Reuben S. Williamson, William Williamson, Polly Vining, Sally Allen, Matilda Williamson, Elizabeth Hines and Pamela Cook, and after the death or marriage of my wife Lilpla Holloway it is my Will and desire that all the perishable property loaned to my wife be equally divided betwixt the same seven persons named in this item
- Item 6th It is my Will and desire that the parts of my estate that will come to Elizabeth Hines and Pamela Cook the foregoing divisions that it shall belong to them two and their children giving their two husbands John W. Hines and John Cook no claim or title to it what ever, but to be for the use of the two women and their children
- Item 7th It is my Will and desire that Corcus Amanda Remore my wife's grand daughter that lives with us have the bed and furniture that she has mostly paid by her own labor and also what furniture she may make whilst she may live with her grand Mother
- Item 8th And last of all I appoint my wife Lilpla Holloway Executrix and Joint Vining Executor of this my last Will and Testament signed, sealed and acknowledged the 29 day of May 1850 in presence of

State of Georgia } In the name of God Amen! I George Croft of
Troup County } said State and county being of advanced age, but
sound in mind and of disposing memory deem it
right and proper both as respects myself and family that I should make
a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me
do therefore make ordain and constitute this my last Will and Testament
hereby revoking all other heretofore made by me

1st Item I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christian
like manner

2nd Item I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid by my Executors and
Executors hereinafter appointed

3rd Item I desire and direct that my Executors and Executors shall manage
the property as may seem most advantageous and profitable for the good
of all concerned provided the principal of the property be not infringed
on, but the profits arising from planting or hiring out the Negroes be
applied to the support of my wife Mary Croft and son George - my son
George to be supported and educated until he is able to help himself and then
he must get into some business as soon as possible so that he may sup-
port himself. The little Negroes that I herein have distributed and bequea-
red can be taken away at my death, except those given to son George and
son they must remain until they are capable of receiving them or become
of a mature age

4th Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Lyon and her children
the girl Harriett and her little infant sister now at the breast for their use
and separate use, free from the disposition or control or debt of a present
or future husband and as she has much more than any of the balance
of my children, I hope she will be satisfied with these two for her
part of the Negro property

5th Item I give and bequeath unto my son Edwards children Roy Tom forever

6th Item I give and bequeath unto my son Obedience Roy Sam forever

7th Item I give and bequeath unto my son George Roy Anthony and girl
Hannah and unto my son Ray Roy Samuel and girl Sallie which
Negroes they are to have over and above the balance of my children

8th Item I give and bequeath unto my son Benjamin at the death or marriage of
my wife Mary Croft Roy Clean and child Sarah to have and to hold
forever

9th Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary J. Harpser wife of P. S. Harpser
