

Benjamin H. Montgomery and Will.

Troup County Wills 1832-1838
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Georgia Troup County. The last Will and Testament of Benjamin H. Montgomery, made, signed and sealed his death being known to in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty three.

Item 1st It is my Will that first of all my best debts should be paid
Item 2nd It is my Will that all my property be sold in accordance with the Law, and to divide the same into two equal parts one half to belong to my beloved wife, Marinda, Montgomery during her widowhood, the other half to belong to my Daughter Elizabeth, Rebecca Montgomery.

Item 3rd If my wife, Marinda, Montgomery should at any time think proper to marry again, it is my Will, that her former and all the property should be secured to my Daughter before marriage, and my wife to have the use of it during her natural life.

Item 4th I hereby call that John Rogers & James H. Montgomery both of proper age and sane state aforesaid, be my executors to this Will signed and sealed the day and year above written in the presence of.

and his dying memory, and that he did it of his own free will without compulsion and that he did not have any other person the same with him as a subscribing witness all at the request of the testator.
