Muscogee County 3/ This Indenture made Nov. 9th 1832.

In the name of God Amen. I Bennett Posey being of sound mind and disposing memory, make this my last Will and testament, and dispose of my earthly effects in the manner following that is to say, I recommend my soul to God who gave it, and my body to the earth, to be deposited in a decent Christian like manner.

Item 1st My will and request is that all my Just debts be first paid by my Executors.

Item 2nd I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Nancy Posey one negro fellow by the name of Dave during her lifetime and one negro girl by the name of Minney during her lifetime, I also will and bequeath to her my house and furniture to dispose of as she may think proper, I also will and bequeath to her during her life one horse saddle and bridle.

Item 3rd I will and bequeath to my son Grim Posey one negro fellow by the name of Burrow his wife Sarah and her two boy children the eldest by the name of Perry, the names of the other not recollectet.

Item 4th I will and bequeath to my son James Posey two negro one by the name of Mitley and the other Nancy one Negro fellow by the name of Dave, after the death of his mother, who has a lifetime estate in Dave.

Item 5th I will and bequeath to my son Lemmon Posey one Negro Strooman by the name of Anna and her two Children Luke and Tom, also one negro girl by the name of Charity and Minney after the death of his mother who has a lifetime estate in Minney.

Item 6th I will and bequeath to Harrison Revell my son in law One dollar to be paid by my Executors if applied for.

Item 7th I will and bequeath to my son in law John Kimbrough One dollar to be paid by my Executors if applied for.

Item 8th I will and bequeath to Elizabeth Kimbrough's children formerly Elizabeth Posey the sum of Fifty Dollars each if applied for.

- Item 1st My Will and bequeath the sum of two Hundred Dollars to my son Jubell Green Posey for the same.
- Item 2nd My Will and bequeath to my deceased son Chasdy Posey's Children the sum of fifteen dollar each if they ever apply for the same to my Executors.
- Item 3rd My Will and bequeath to my three sons Green Posey, James Posey and Lemmon Posey my Land and stock of every description to be sold by them, and equally divided amongst the three, and my will is that they jointly the several sums which I have specified to the individuals herein mentioned whenever they apply for the same out of the money raised by the sale of my Land and Stock.
- Item 4th My Will and appoint Green Posey, James Posey and Lemmon Posey my Executors to see that this my last will and Testament is carried in full effect. Switness whereof I have here to at my hand and seal this ninth day of November 1832.

Item: Second; I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Glasp
Ten Dollars.

Item: Third; I give and bequeath unto my daughter Vinny Bates
Ten Dollars.

Item: Fourth; I give and bequeath unto my son Hardy Nelson Lots of the
Numbers one hundred and fourteen in the fifteenth District formerly
Carroll new Troup County, and all that part of the Number one
hundred & fifty, and one hundred and fifty one, lying on the
side of the Mehadka brook, in the fifteenth District formerly
Carroll new Troup County, also one hundred and fifty six, and one
hundred and fifty seven in the fifteenth District formerly Carroll
new Troup County; and one hundred and fifty head of Stock Cattle,
and one negro boy named little Frank, about sixteen years old,
One good horse, bridle and saddle, and one bed and furniture.

Item: Fifth; I give and bequeath ^{unto} my Daughter Nancy Nelson, One
Thousand Dollars in Cash, and a negro girl named Ginny also
thirteen years old, fifty head of Stock Cattle, and one good Horse
Bridle and saddle, and one bed and furniture.

Item: Sixth; I give and bequeath the balance of my property, both
Real and personal, not herein before disposed of, after the pay-
ment of my just debts, unto my two sons John H. and Hardy
and my three Daughters, Matilda, Garbriugh and Elizabeth
Hammack and Nancy Nelson, to be equally divided among
them.

And I do hereby appoint William Stinson, William Moore
and Winston Wood my executors to this my last Will
and Testament: In testimony whereof I have hereunto set
my hand and seal, this eighth day of April Eighteen hun-
dred thirty three.
