 Fulton County, ³ I Charles M. Baller being weak in body but of
 sound mind and memory knowing

that it is appointed once for all mankind to die, apprehending the con-
 certainty of life - the time of my dissolution only known to him who
 gave me being and in order to prepare my mortal matter for that event
 I have thought proper to make this my last Will and Testament

Item first I desire my body decently interred and all my just debts be paid

Item 2nd It is my Will and desire that the distribution share bequeathed me in the
 last Will and Testament of my late beloved husband Doctor Andrew
 Baller deceased be separated from the balance of his Estate by the Rules
 of distribution pointed out in his Will or in accordance to law and
 that my said Distribution share of said Estate be equally divided between
 my dear Children Maria Jane Baller, Mary Hawkins, Baller and John
 Collier Baller to be enjoyed by them during their natural lives and at
 their deaths, to be equally divided between the heirs of this body legally
 begotten. In the event of either of my said Children dying childless or
 without lawful issue the share of said Child so dying is to be equally
 divided between the surviving Child or children and to descend to
 his or her or their surviving heirs.

Item 3rd It is further my Will and desire that the aforesaid distribution share
 of said Estate be bequeathed by me to be equally divided betwixt each of
 my said Children before named be placed in the hands of a Trustee
 to be appointed by a court of Chancery for that purpose and be con-
 trolled and managed by said Trustee for the separate use & benefit
 of his particular trust and that no portion of the principal sum be
 permitted at any time to be spent except for necessary food and
 clothing and that the limitation of said Trust Estate of five only
 at the death of each of my before mentioned Children.
 And lastly I hereby constitute and appoint my special and
 particular friends John C. Dawson and Dr. Charles L. Marlowe
 my executors to carry this my last Will and testament into
 effect.

Chapman v. On open hearing made before David W Morgan one
of the Justices of the Peace in the said County of Baldwin and produced the
last Will and Testament of the said Caroline M Bailey Deed and John C.
Dawson one of the subscribing Witnesses to said Will and the said John C.
Dawson being duly sworn saith that he saw Caroline M Bailey sign
said Will and declare the said instrument to be her last Will and Testament as her
last Will and Testament freely and voluntarily and of her own accord
and without any compulsion or influence whatever, that at the time of
the execution of said Will said Testator was of sound disposing
mind & memory that defendant signed said Will as Witness in the
presence of Testator and at her special instance and request and also
that the said William B Stokes & Milton C Bacon sign said Will as
Witnesses in the presence of said Testator and at her special request
and also in the presence of each other and which said proof being
considered sufficient by the Court and no objection being urged, it
is ordered by the Court that said last Will & Testament be admitted to
record
