

181 The Last Will and Testament,
of Robert Curtis dec^d

In the name of 'God amen':
I Robert, Curtis being of sound mind and
memory but, of sick of body do make this
my last, will and testament,
First I commit my body to the
grave and my soul to god who gave it—
Item the first— It is my will and desire
that my Executor do pay all my just
debts and funeral Expenses and then the
remainder of my property or worldly goods
to be disposed of in manner & form following
Item second— It is my will that my
property be kept all together, so long as
my wife remains a widow and if my
wife should ~~die~~ ^{die} again it is my will
that she (my wife) have all the negro
property which I got by her when I
married her viz: Elam a boy and
Clarrissa a young woman and her two
children

Item third— It is my will that my
wife little daughter Sarah Jane ~~Item~~ =
=bridge be educated and raised on an
equal footing with my other children

Item fourth— All my first children
by my first wife having been provided
for heretofore with the Exception of
Elizabeth Ann Sazant there is provi-
=ded her a bed and bedding

Item fifth It is my will and wish
that my wife Eliza C. Curtis and John
Hill be my Executors to Execute this
my last will and testament
