I, Jane Davis, in the name of God Amen
 of the County of Troup, State of Georgia, do hereby
 advanced in years and now laboring under
 bodily affliction but of mind sound
 and of sound memory make this my last
 will and testament.

I resign my soul to God in an-
 its, and my body to be buried in the earth
 to be interred in a plain and Christian
 like manner; and that portion of prop-
 erty which God has entrusted to my
 care to be disposed of in the following
 manner: viz; at my death after
 paying all my lawful debts I will and
 bequeath my property to be equally divided
 among my children, to-wit; Mary Joyce
 Abigail Criddle, Sarah Hunter, Jane
 Ward, Elizabeth Pierden, Anna Davis
 and Silas K. Davis with this provision,
 that, Elizabeth Pierden is only to have
 her life time Estate in the portion allotted
 her which is to be under the control
 and direction of the Executors to this
 will who must supply her with such
 necessaries and conveniences as may
 be thought proper prudent by herself &
 them and at her death what property
 may be remaining, or all that may have
 accrued from her part of my Estate
 must revert back to the balance of
 my legacies to be divided equally among
 them. I appoint Mr. Son-in-Law
 Stephen Ward and my son Silas K.
 Davis as Executors to conduct and
