

The Last Will & Testament of
Simcon H. Early, dec'd.

I, Simcon H. Early, of
 Troup County, in full health but
 disposing mind feel it to be right
 to dispose of my property in the following
 manner hereafter decreed. I leave all
 my property in the care of my wife Almira
 E. Early to be kept together & as joint stock
 until my youngest child becomes of age
 allowing each one of my children as
 they become of age to have the portion
 suitable to their condition also my wife is
 authorized to give to each one of my
 children such property as she may feel
 willing to dispose of at the time of such
 division household or any other property
 keeping an account of the same so that
 each child may receive equal amount.
 This property to be valued by disinterested
 persons at the time of such division.
 My wife Almira E. Early to have the
 balance of the property until the youngest
 child becomes of age then for the whole
 of my Estate to be equally divided between
 my wife and children and in addition
 to what my wife's part is for her to
 receive two thousand dollars extra on her
 part - It is my will and desire that
 in case of my wife's death or remar-
 riage then for my property to be equally
 divided between my children and
 wife Almira E. Early December 8th 1847
