

Georgia In the name of God Amen

Troup County I Elizabeth Hill of said State and County being of advanced age and knowing that I must shortly depart from this world deem it right and proper both as respects myself and my family that I should make a disposition of the property which a kind providence has blessed me I therefore make this my last Will and Testament

- Item 1st I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner suitable to my Circumstances and Condition
- Item 2nd I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executors hereinafter named, as I am unwilling my creditors should be delayed of their right, especially as there is no necessity for delay
- Item 3rd I give and bequeath to my son Robert Hill my negro man Sam about thirty years old and one half of my beds and bedsteads and house hold effects to him and his heirs forever
- Item 4th I give and bequeath to my son William E Hill my buggy & harness and one half of my beds and bedsteads and household furniture to him and his heirs forever
- Item 5th I desire and direct that my two negroes to wit Henry a woman and Cornelia a boy be sold at public sale to the highest bidder and the proceeds of the sale of said negroes to be equally divided between my son William E Hill my daughter Eveline F Reid, and Ann S Dallas my grand son Robert S Longford and my three grand daughters daughters of deceased daughter Eliza C Stone Wey, to have their mothers part between them, with the exception hereinafter mentioned
- Item 6th I give and bequeath to my grand son Robert S Longford all my money after all my just debts is paid from the cash notes and accounts I have on hand at the time of my death to him and his heirs forever
- Item 7th I desire and direct that my son Robert after my death raise a proper Tomb Stone over my grave
- Item 8th I desire and direct that a similar Tombstone to the one raised over my grave, be raised over the grave of my deceased husband to be paid for out of the proceeds of the sale of the two negroes before mentioned
- Item 9th I constitute and appoint my beloved sons Robert and William E Hill Executors to this my last Will and Testament, this October the 12th 1859

Troup County Robert Hill and William E Hill Executors nominated in the within paper printing proposed the same as the last Will and Testament of Elizabeth Hill late of said County deceased and duly proved before me and my clerk Henry Benson William M Bates and Early Baker all of the subscribing witnesses to the same who being duly sworn depose to the validity and execution of the Testatrix at the time she executed said last Will and Testament and all other facts and circumstances corroborative with the same

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Same is duly proven and that the same be admitted to Record as the true last Will and Testament of said Elizabeth Hill deceased that the above said Robert and William C. Heise be qualified as Executors of the Same and that Letters Testamentary be granted them accordingly which being done Letters were accordingly granted. It is further ordered that the Hon. & Right Hon. J. L. Long, B. H. Henderson, John Cortis and Wilson Thruce be appointed to appraise said estate and make return of the Same in terms of the Law.
