

A friend having requested me to make a disposition of the servants. I have seeing life not certain I give (through the mercy of God being able to write it my self) to my nephews as follows; if God should see fit to call me away before then to my nephew George Samuel Bailey a servant boy named Aaron and a woman named Susan daughter of Lucy the boy to dispose of as he sees right and proper the girl at his death to his children with all her increase if any and for his wife during her life if she should out live him - and not get married again - in case of her marriage the child takes possession to my nephew Charles John Bailey George & Bailey's son I give a boy named John a woman named Adeline to take possession of at twenty one years of age his father to hold them until he Charles & Bailey shall be twenty one - I also give to my nephew George Samuel Bailey a woman named Julia & one Lucy his life time & one named Frances also - to be divided among his children with all their increase at his death to Winton Crawford & give Sarah Frances child and Frances boy her older children two in number a girl & boy as soon as he arrives at twenty one or at their father's death (George & Bailey) to William Alexander Bailey - a boy call'd Brock George Hairston Bailey a boy call'd Mills and a girl call'd Bet or Elizabeth Lucy's child - to Samuel Bowling Bailey a boy call'd Norman - to Milton Octavius Bailey a boy call'd Wesley and a girl named Caroline for Winton & Bailey to take possession of the woman call'd Lydia Angus wife at twenty one as Angus will then be his property - a girl call'd Georgiana Lucy's daughter to my nephew George Samuel his life time to revert to his children at his death & in case of the death of any child (their property reverts to his Brothers) equally (their father's children) George & Bailey's children I mean to the children of my niece Mary Elizabeth Bailey Traylor wife of John H. Traylor to her son John C. Traylor I give a boy call'd Wilber Adelines son - to her son Robert I give a boy call'd J. to Lucy's child to her son George M. Traylor a boy call'd Jay - to her son Charles Hairston Traylor I give a boy call'd Dickson otherwise Humphrey and a girl call'd Mary to Thomas H. Traylor a boy call'd Adam - if my brother in law Charles C. Bailey & my sister his wife chooses to hold the above property - if they should live longer while they live they shall do so the above division I think right set my seal to it. Elizabeth H.
