 Troup County Wills 1832-1848, abt Platillo of the  
 County, state above mentioned being, in good  
 health and of sound mind and memory  
 (prays be to God for the same) and being  
 desirous, to settle my worldly affairs whilst  
 I have strength and capacity, do to do, do  
 make this my last will and testament  
 hereby revoking and making void all  
 former wills by me at any time heretofore  
 made, and first and principally I commit  
 my soul into the hands of my Creator  
 who gave it, and my body to the earth  
 and as to such worldly estate wherewith  
 it hath pleased God to entrust me  
 I dispose of the same as followeth -

First, I will to my daughter Elizabeth  
 Harrison my negro man Harry and the  
 hundred acres of land that I now live  
 upon with the stock and horse and my  
 household furniture consisting of two  
 beds and furniture with all of the rest  
 of the furniture that I have at my  
 death with all notes of hand or money  
 that I die in possession of  
 Second, I will to each one of the  
 balance of my children two dollars in  
 cash to be paid to them by Elizabeth  
 Harrison when called upon after my  
 death - and I make and ordain  
 Elizabeth Harrison to execute to this my  
 last will and testament, this 27<sup>th</sup> day  
 of March 1836 - Signed Sealed and  
 acknowledged in the presence

of us

The Last Will and testament of James  
McCallay deceased

Georgia I Now all men by these presents  
of Troup County, that I James McCallay of  
the State and County aforesaid being weak in  
body but of perfect mind and memory do make  
and ordain this my last will and testament  
in manner and form following viz: first I  
give and bequeath to my daughter Margarette  
McCallay two thousand dollars in Silver and  
I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth  
McCallay the like sum of two thousand dollars  
in Silver and I give and bequeath to my  
daughter Jane Eledge two small negroes namely  
Mary & Julia and I give and bequeath to  
my daughter Matilda Hairston two small  
negroes namely Celah and Millie, and I give  
and bequeath to my daughter Nancy Capp two  
negroes namely Nelly and Willis and I give  
and bequeath to my son William McCallay  
two small negroes namely Joe & John and I  
give and bequeath to my grand son James  
McCallay the sum of Six hundred dollars  
and I give and bequeath to my grandson  
James Capp two hundred dollars  
All the rest and residue of my Estate goods  
and chattels I give to my beloved wife Mar-
