

The Last Will & Testament of Elizabeth
Montgomery

April 21st 1857

In the name of God Amen

I Elizabeth Montgomery being in perfect
memory thanks be to God for his mercies
but as it is appointed for me to die I
make this my last will & Testament, that
is to say- I give and bequeath to my dear
James Montgomery five hundred dollars at
my death twenty dollars of the same sum to
be paid to his daughter Elizabeth more than
the rest and the balance to be equally divided
with her and the rest of his children - as they
come of age also I give and bequeath to George
Davis his wife five hundred dollars to
be equally divided among my daughters James
children as they come of age also I give &
bequeath to John Hurst and his wife Rebecca
five hundred dollars at my death twenty
dollars of the sum to be paid to Elizabeth
Hurst more than the rest, and her to have an
equal part of the balance the same to be
equally divided amongst my daughter Rebecca
children as they come of age also I give and
bequeath to my son David Montgomery at my
death five hundred dollars twenty dollars to be
paid to his daughter Elizabeth more than the
rest and her to have an equal part with the
rest of his children the same to be paid to them
as they come of age also I give and bequeath
to Thomas Cameron and my daughter Sarah
five hundred dollars at my death their
daughter Elizabeth Hedon to have twenty
dollars more than the rest of their children

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and the ballance to be equally divided amongst, my daughter Sarah, Thilman a, they come of age I will give to my daughter Ane W. Wilkerson one young man and at my death, my land and whatever crop may be on hand and all the household furniture that belongs to me and farming tools and stock of all kinds to be sold and Peter Ann Jenkins and Elizabeth Jane Wilkerson to have twenty dollars each and the ballance to be equally divided between Cyrus Jenkins his wifeucking Sandridge and Jephtha Wilkerson and his wife Ane W the same to be equally divided amongst each of their children as they become of age and if any of my present living children should die before their children become of age the above sum to be put out for the use of said children - and I also appoint Cyrus Jenkins and Jephtha Wilkerson
