I Harriette Broome of Said County and State being

of sound and disposing Mind and Memory, and knowing the uncertainty of
human life, deem it prudent and right that I should make such disposition of my
property after death among my Brothers and Sister as I think best for their Welfare and happiness
and in view of the fact as well as in accordance with my Wishes do make and ordain this
as my last Will and Testamente hereby revoking all others heretofore made by me.

Item 1st It is my Will and desire that after death my body shall be buried in a decent and Christian
like Manner suitable to any Condition and Circumstances in life

Item 2nd I desire and direct that all my just debts, if any, shall be paid as soon after my death
as the condition of the case will permit

Item 3rd I give and bequeath to my beloved brother John R. Broome the sum of one thousand dollars
to be paid to him out of my Estate extra and above any of the others of my brothers and
sister except as herein after stated which money I give to him absolutely by
Item 4th I give and bequeath to my beloved Sister Mary Jane Broome all my household and
Kitchen furniture which I may have at my death absolutely, I also give and bequeath
to her my said Sister the sum of Two Thousand dollars, which said sum of two thousand
dollars and household and kitchen furniture I give and bequeath to her own and
above an equal share of my estate And I do furthermore will and direct that my
said Sister Mary Jane Broome shall have my Negro Woman Sallie and her Natural increase
of any, in the division of my negroes at the price or valuation which may be placed on
said Negro Woman Sallie and her increase by the Appraisers of my Estate

Item 5th It is my Will and desire I hereby direct that the house & lot wherein I now live in the
town of Lagrange in Said County, shall not be sold, but kept as a homestead so long as
any two or three of my brothers & sister shall live together or so long as any two shall protest
against its sale, but after the separation of all of them or in the event that all shall
desire its sale, & then direct that my Said house and lot together with its appurtenances
shall be sold by my Executor either privately or publicly and at such time & place
as he may think best for the interest of all the parties concerned. The proceeds arising
from the sale thereof to be divided equally among my brothers & sister living afterwards
and subject to the restrictions herein after specified

Item 6th It is my Will and desire that after the payment of my just debts, funeral expenses
cost of administration & the satisfaction of the specific legacies herein before set forth
that all the remainder or balance of my estate including money, notes, accounts checks
in action negroes, lands and property of every description which I may own at the time
of my death, including those lands which my brother George W. Broome shall have entered
or bought for me in his or my name in the state of Missouri shall be equally divided
between my brother John R. Broome, Charles W. Broome, George W. Broome,
James A. Broome & my Sister Mary Jane Broome with the condition however
that my said Sister is to have in the division of my negroes the said woman Sallie
and her natural increase at the price or valuation put upon them by the
appraisers as aforesaid

Item 7th The share or portion of my estate which I give and bequeath to my brothers as specified
in item 6th, I give it to them each upon this condition & with this restriction, that if
either dies without child or children his share or portion shall revert back and be
equally divided among any surviving brother & sister & the child or children of any brother
that may be deceased of said brother if dead, this condition & restriction to attach
to the share or portion of each brother in case of death without child or children and
in the event of such division the child or children of deceased brother or said
sister if dead shall be entitled to & receive the share or portion of the same that their
parent would be entitled to if living

Item 8th The part or share of my estate which I give and bequeath to my sister Mary Jane Broome
as mentioned in item 6th and including said Negro Woman Sallie & her natural increase

together with the said sum of two thousand dollars give her in item 4th & give
and devise it to her upon the following terms & conditions to wit, that she shall have
and hold it for her sole & separate use benefit and behoof and free from the debts
liabilities, contracts, control or marital rights of any husband that she may marry, and
that in the event of her death without child or children her share or portion of my estate
thus given her shall revert back and be equally divided among my brothers surviving
and the child or children of any brother that may be dead, the child or children of
deceased brother if any, to occur in such division that part which their father would if
living & nothing more.

Item 9th I will and devise and hereby direct that all the moveable property & real estate which
I may own at the time of my death & necessary to be sold for the purpose of carrying out this
my will shall be by my Executor sold either publicly or privately without any order
of Court & at such time & place upon such terms & conditions as he may think best for the
interest of all parties concerned.

Item 10th In order that there shall be no misunderstanding or doubt as to the persons to whom
have given and devised my property specified in the foregoing items of this my will
I will mention that in accordance with the terms, conditions & provisions and manner
of this my will & testament hereinbefore specified & set forth I give bequeath and devise the
whole of my estate including money, notes, accounts, choses in action, Negro lands in Georgia
& Alabama and every other description of property owned by me at the time of my death to my
said brothers John R. Broome, Charles W. Broome, George W. Broome, James W. Broome & my
Sister Mary Jane Broome to be distributed & given to them each according to the provisions
in the manner hereinbefore directed by this my will and subject to the terms conditions &
instructions thereof & that when I speak of a division among child or children of any deceased
brother or sister I mean the child or children of my said brother & Sister Mary Jane Broome
and no one else.

Item 11th I nominate & appoint my beloved brother Charles W. Broome Executor of this my last will
& testament. In testifying whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal
this the 16th sixteenth day of August 1858 Henrietta Broome (E. B.)
