of life and knowing that it is my duty for

with; and being of sound disposing mind
memory & judgement do make declare and
ordain this my last will and testament
(herby revoking all other wills heretofore by
me made) in manner and form following: viz:
First. I give and bequeath my soul to God
who gave it and my body to be decently
interred.

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Second. To my beloved son James Carter Hicks,
I give and bequeath our horse saddle & bridle
to be valued at the sum of eight dollars to
him and his heirs forever.

Third. To my beloved daughter Susan Ann
Hicks, I give and bequeath our Bed, Bedstead
and furniture also one cow to her & her heirs
forever.

Fourth. To my beloved daughter Eliza
Thomas Hicks, I give and bequeath our
Bed, Bedstead & furniture, also one cow to her
and her heirs forever.

Fifth. To my beloved daughter Martha
Hicks, I give and bequeath our Bed, Bed-
stead and furniture also one cow to her &
her heirs forever.

Sixth. To my beloved daughter Emily
Hicks, I give & bequeath one Bed Bedstead &
furniture - also one cow to her & her heirs forever
(forward)

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Fourth, All the residue of my property both real and personal and of whatever nature kind or quality of which I may be legally seized and possessed at the time of my decease after the payment of my just debts I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary Hick, during her natural life and after her death to be sold and the mts proceeds arising therefrom be equally divided between my beloved children Lucinda Rain, Mary Jane Douth, Elizabeth Johnson, Pomilia Ann Timmons, Malinda Timmons, Susan Ann Hick, Gilliam Thompson Hick, Wyatt Johnson Hick, Eliza Thomas Hick, Martha Hick, James Carter Hick, Emily Hick, Sarah and a share of the real, to them and their heirs forever.

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Eighth, It is my will and desire that my beloved sons in law Bryant Johnson, & Thomas J. C. Timmons shall be my Executors to this my last will and testament.
