The Last will and Testament of John
Appl decd

Georgia Whereas I am sick and in
Troup County, all human frailties will
shortly depart this life and being desirous of
disposing of my affairs in this world I do
make the following my last will and testa-
ments to be in full force after my death.

Article 1st I do will unto my Sister
Martha E. Langford and to the heirs of
her body my negro boy Jim to be held by
her for her own use and benefit during her
natural life, and at the death of her
and her heirs it is my will that it
Jim be returned to my other brothers &
Sisters and to be equally shared by
them.

Article 2nd It is my will that my
Sister Nancy E. have and hold for
her own proper use and benefit my
negro girl Maria and to have and
hold her during her natural life.

Article 3rd I do will unto my brother
William E. Hill my negro boy Prince
to be held and owned by him for his
own proper use and benefit during his
natural life.

Article 4th I do desire and will that
all lawful demands against me be paid
and that the notes and accounts which
I hold against others be put into the
hands of my Brother-in-law O. M. Stone
now residing in Hamilton Harris County
for collection and settlement; and I
do further will that the proceeds of said
notes and accounts together with my inter-
ests in a negro woman Sukey and a
forever.

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a negro boy named George and a boy named Dick shall be equally divided between my mother Elizabeth Hill my brother Robert E Hill my sister Francis E Hill and my sister Eliza L Stone

Article 3rd I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my mother Elizabeth Hill Executrix and Albert Gregg Executor of this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all other and former wills by me at any time made heretofore

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the first day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty.
