 evening the twenty eighth day of April  
 in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred  
 and forty eight, at the instance of  
 Mr. John Holloway before his death  
 about twenty six hours before his death  
 in perfect possession of his mental fac-  
 ulties he called upon us to remember  
 and take notice of what he meant  
 to say, that his will was that  
 1st I want all of my just debts paid  
 2nd What, my wife Susan Holloway  
 shall have all of my property both  
 real and personal <sup>any way</sup>  
 She may think proper to sell or to  
 buy, but if she marries and they there  
 is to be division and she is to have  
 a child, first, and the balance to  
 be equally divided amongst my children
