Allen Holloway dec'd

Witnessed by Me Hiram Dennis
Wm. Dennis, Albert G. Holloway
and Eveline Lindsey were present last
evening the twenty eighth day of April
in the year of our Lord Eighteen hun-
dred forty eight, at the residence of
Mr. Allen Holloway before his death-
about twenty six hours before his death
in perfect possession of his mental fac-
ulties he called upon us to remember
and take notice of what he was about
to say, that his will was that
1st I want all of my just debt paid-
2nd That my wife Susan Holloway
shall have all of my property both
real and personal and any may
she may think proper to sell or to
buy, but if she marries and then there
is to be division and she is to have
a child, part, and the balance to
be equally divided amongst my children-
3rd I further want if she marries
a Guardian appointed by the Court
for them the said children - And
I want them (my children) kept
together if possible
4th And lastly I appoint my wife,
Susan Holloway my Sole Executrix
to this my last will and testament
