make this my last Will & Testament hereby Respecting all others

Item 1<sup>st</sup>

It is my Will that on the first day of January next my Truly friends  
Admund S Harris, Thomas Greenwood and Albert Coy having respect to  
my whole negro property, select a lot which they shall value to be worth five  
thousand dollars and I give said negro to my daughter Elizabeth S  
Overby

Item 2<sup>nd</sup>

I give and bequeath unto John B Gordon in Trust and for the sole use  
benefit and enjoyment of my daughter Fanny R Gordon another lot  
of like value and to be selected by the same men at the same time said  
property not subject to the debts of the said John B or any future husband  
which she may have

Item 3<sup>rd</sup>

It is my Will that on the marriage, or arrival at Twenty one years of age  
of any of my children <sup>of my children of legal age</sup> ~~of my children~~ <sup>of my children</sup> ~~of my children~~ <sup>of my children</sup>  
Charles S, Lemora and Hugh A Harralson I do that  
the same persons if living select lots from my negroes of like value as  
those of the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Items of this Will and if any or all of my said  
friends die before such distribution is to be made then other fit persons to  
be chosen by my executors and the Ordinary of said County shall make  
such distribution, Here I give my Wife power if in her  
judgement it is for the interest of the children to settle in Trust upon them  
and each of them and she may appoint Trustees to carry such intention  
into effect

Item 4<sup>th</sup>

It is my Will that all the Residue of my Estate both Real and Personal be  
given to my beloved Wife during her natural life subject to the divisions  
aforesaid

Item 5<sup>th</sup>

It is my Will that if any or each of my children who are now married or  
may hereafter marry, die without issue before a final distribution of my  
Estate they or their husbands take no part of the undivided Estate in  
the hands of my Wife, &

Item 6<sup>th</sup>

It is my Will that at the death of my Wife the whole Estate bequeathed to her be  
equally divided between my children and their heirs and I further Will that  
the portion of my Estate in the possession of my Wife at the time of her death  
she may either turn over in fee simple to my children or their heirs or she may  
at her discretion settle in Trust upon them for their sole and separate use

Item 7<sup>th</sup>

It is my Will that my Alabama lands be letted for minerals at not too  
heavy an expense, the amount to be in the discretion of my Executors

Item 8<sup>th</sup>

I relinquish all claims which I may have or hold on Charles S Harralson  
son of my brother Kinchen S Harralson

Item 9<sup>th</sup>

I give to my brother Kinchen S Harralson and his son Hugh A Harralson  
one third interest in the minerals of my Alabama lands provided they shall  
be at one third of the expense of working the same I request of my Brother  
H. S. Harralson to relieve my Estate of all liability on his account as  
soon as possible

Item 10<sup>th</sup>

I give unto my nephew Hugh A Harralson son of H. S. Harralson my  
Rifle, shot gun, pistols and my horse Doctor Dark and a saddle and bit

Item 11<sup>th</sup>

It is my Will that a suitable marble monument not to cost less than  
fifty dollars be erected over the grave of my devoted and faithful  
servant Starling with a suitable epitaph

Item 12<sup>th</sup>

I give to my Boy Surex one Hundred dollars to be paid in instalment  
of Ten dollars annually upon condition that he faithfully wait upon and  
be obedient to his Mistress and wholly abstain from intemperance drinks

Term 13<sup>th</sup>

This money to be paid or withheld at the direction of my Wife  
 I hereby nominate and appoint my Wife Caroline M. Haralson and B. H. Overby  
 executor to this my last Will and Testament and I desire them or the survivor of them  
 with power to change the bequest Real or personal at private sale or buy Real or personal  
 property or do any other thing which may be of interest for the whole property, she may make  
 additional distributions amongst the children if in her judgement their wants may  
 demand such division leaving this subject discretionary with her. The amounts so to  
 be given shall not exceed annually the sum of Two Thousand dollars to any one child  
 I desire that full Return be annually made by my executors to the court of ordinary  
 touching their acts on my bequest

Term 14<sup>th</sup>

It is my Will that my children Caroline C. be maintained and that George and Hugh  
 A. be maintained and educated till they arrive at the age of twenty one years or more  
 without charge of their portions of any the late. And I further desire that my executors  
 use their best efforts to educate my Son with habits of industry upon the ground  
 that idleness tends to dissipation and is the parent of almost every vice.
