

Isaac Culberson's Will

I, Isaac Culberson Considering the uncertainty of this Mortal life and being of a sound mind and memory, make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following: First I give my soul into the hands of him who gave it, hoping and believing in the remission of sins: and my worldly Estate, I give and devise as follows:—

1st It is my will and desire that all my Debts should be paid out of my Estate:

2nd It is further my will and desire that all my Estate both real & personal be kept in Common Stock for the raising and educating my Children; at the Disposal of my wife, Polly Culberson during her lifetime or Widowhood, and in Case of her interment age or accident, that an equal distribution of all my estate shall be made to all my legacies: It is further my wish that the property left in the hands of my wife be disposed of in Case of any of the Childrens living her at or after Mature age at her Discretion having due regard to an equal Distribution.

3rd I do hereby nominate and appoint my wife Polly my Executor and my Brother James Culberson my Executor for the purpose of Carrying into effect this my last Will and Testament.
