 my last will and testament hereby revoking and

First I desire and direct that my body be buried in a
 decent and Christian-like manner. Suitable to my
 circumstances and condition in life. My soul I trust
 shall return to rest with God who gave it as I hope
 for salvation through the merits of the blessed Lord and
 Saviour Jesus Christ.

Secondly I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid
 without delay by my Executors hereinafter named and
 appointed.

Thirdly. I give bequeath and devise to my beloved wife
 Elizabeth my house and lot whereon I now reside
 situated lying and being in the Village of Mountville
 in the Seventh District of Troup County bounded north
 by the Lagrange and Greenville roads. East by the
 Masonic Hall and Grocery lot South by the lands of
 Lewis Bradfield and west by the lands of Joseph
 Bradfield containing Five Acres more or less with
 all the rights members and appurtenances to said
 house and lot of land in any wise belonging free
 from all charges and limitations whatever to
 her own proper use benefit and behoof with
 full power to dispose of the same as she may deem
 fit to her interest and the interest of the heirs
 and the said dwelling house to be completed and
 paid for out of my Estate.

Fourthly. The above named property which I have given and bequeath-
 ed to my wife is for her natural life or widowhood
 and at her marriage the above named property
 shall be sold and equally divided between her and
 my children as hereinafter mentioned and at her
 death the above named property shall be sold and
 equally divided among my children as hereinafter
 mentioned.

Sixthly. I devise and direct that the residue of my Estate both
 real and personal to be sold to the highest bidder and
 the proceeds thereof to be equally divided between
 my wife and children.

Sevently I devise and direct that the portion of my Estate
 which is going to my daughters to w. Martha A. Wells
 Jane J. Harman, Sarah C. Nelson, Susan Frances
 Penelope Margaret McIsaac and Ella Vincent
 shall be for their and the heirs of their bodies sole and
 separate use for and during their natural lives—

- exempt from the debts and liabilities of the present or
 future husband.
 I hereby appoint my trustworthly son W^H Fincher
 Guardian of the persons and property of my minor children
 to-wit, Susan Fincher Penelope, Margaret Whifouri, Jane
 Robert Taylor, Isaac Davis, Ella Vincent and Abigail
 Pillsbury
 I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife
 Elizabeth Fincher and my trustworthly son W^H Fincher
 Executors to this my last Will and Testament.
