Jane Hendrick Deceased Will.

With a view to dispose of my property, while in the enjoyment of the healthy and sound exercise of my mind, I do hereby make this my last will and testament; my first wish and direction is that all my just debts be paid.

And that two of my best beds and bedsteads with suitable for each be given to my son James Hendrick and the other to my daughter Sarah Crompton.

And it is further my will that Henry my Woman about forty or fifty years old, and Bob about twelve years old be both given to my son John W. Hendrick.

And it is further my Will that Sally my Woman about Twenty five years old and William about seven years old be given to my daughter Eliza C. Reed and to the heirs of her body, I give also to my daughter Eliza C. Reed my Chest of Drawers.

And it is further my Will that every thing else I own besides the property specified, be equally divided between my son John W. Hendrick and my daughter Eliza C. Reed after my death, I wish this my last Will, to be executed by my son John W. Hendrick and my son in law William Reed, who I hereby appoint my Executors.
