The Last Will & Testament of Sepe No Bode decd.

Georgia In the name of God, Amen.

Frank County I, Sepe No Bode being weak in body but of sound and disposing mind and knowing that all men must die and for the betterment of all my business do hereby make and ordain this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills.

At my death I resign my soul into the hands of my merciful Creator who has bestowed me hitherto, and my body into the hands of my executioner here in after named to be decently buried, and as to my worldly Estate I give and dispose of the same in the following manner.

First Paid all the just debts against me.

Second I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Rhoda Anne during her life time or otherwise the following property viz. The plantation and land wherein I now live containing three hundred and twelve acres more or less and one Negro man named Ben and Frank his wife and Mandie Frank's child also Eliza and Caroline (Rachael children) and two choice horses or mules, also one Dr Cart and Yoke of Oxen, four Cows and calves of her own choosing and two yearlings also fifteen head of Stock Dogs of her choosing and one years provision also all the House hold and Kitchen furniture except the books.

Third I give bequeath and confirm what I have already given to my daughter Martha Ann wife of William Lancaster I have given her already one Horse bridle and saddle worth 100.00 one Cow and Calf worth 10.00 110.00 one Bed Bedstead and furniture 35.00 one Negro boy named James 500.00 555.00 one Negg girl Barnett 500.00

Fourth I give bequeath and confirm what I have already given to my daughter Mary Ann wife of Pitts Doekson I have given her already one Horse bridle and saddle worth 100.00 one Cow and Calf worth 10.00 110.00 one Bed Bedstead and furniture 35.00 one Negg girl Eliza 500.00 555.00 also I gave her also 500.00

Fifth I give bequeath and confirm what I have already given to my son John G. I have given him already one Cow and Calf worth 10.00 one Bed Bedstead and furniture 35.00 one Horse bridle and saddle 100.00 135.00 one Negg boy Willis 500.00 also I give him Negg boy George worth 500.00

Sixth I give bequeath and confirm what I have already given to my son James G. already given one saddle worth \$10.00 one hundred dollars cash \$100.00 one hundred and fifty dollars cash \$150.00 Two hundred and fifty dollars cash \$250.00 Eighty five dollars cash \$85.00

Seventh I give bequeath and confirm what I have already given to my son Sepe H. Already given Three hundred dollars cash \$300.00 Fifty five dollars cash \$55.00 Sixty five dollars cash \$65.00 Fifteen dollars cash \$15.00 Fifty one \$3.00 dollars cash \$3.00 One hundred dollars cash \$100.00

Eighth I give bequeath and confirm what I have already given to my daughter Susannah Elizabeth wife of Sanford Gunston, I have given her one hundred Negro worth \$500.00 one Cow and Calf \$10.00 one Horse saddle and bridle worth \$100.00 one Bed Bedstead and furniture \$35.00

Ninth I give and bequeath to my son William Young one Negro boy George worth \$500.00 Tenth I give and bequeath to my son Benjamin Franklin one Negro boy named Jim worth \$500.00

Eleventh I give and bequeath to my daughter Pamela Jane one negro girl named Mary worth \$50.00

Twelfth In this instrument I have given some of my children have received more and some less property which is not to be so at the final settlement of my estate

each of my Children or their representatives for them are to receive each equal share of my Estate; One of my Children is not to have one dollar more than another of my Children share and share alike I here constitute and appoint my son John G. and my son James G and my son in Law David Mc Pickle Executors to this my last will and testament.
