 Item 1st I commend my soul to God who gave it and my body to be buried
 in a Christian like manner.
 Item 2^d It is my will and desire that all my just debts and funeral expenses
 be paid and the balance of my property both real and personal
 be disposed in manner and form following.
 Item 3^d It is my will and desire that my entire Estate remain in the possession
 of my beloved wife Nancy Johnson during her natural life or
 widowhood to be used by her in all proper ways for the maintenance
 of herself and her family.
 Item 4th It is my desire that my wife should in a widow make my
 youngest children become of age at which time it is my will and
 desire that they be made equal to my eldest children or at the
 division of my estate which is to be equally divided among
 my legal heirs at the death or marriage of my said wife
 Nancy Johnson.
 Item 5th It is my will and desire that my wife take care of and rear
 as she may think best my Grand Child, Eugene Amstutz whose
 mother is now in our care and that upon his attaining the age of
 twenty one years it is my will and desire that my daughter
 shall provide for him my said Grand Child, a good substantial
 home together with saddle and bridle the whole to be worth the
 sum of twenty five dollars or thereabouts to be paid out of the
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Item 6th I constitute and appoint my sons Ebenezer T. Johnson and William
 H. Johnson Executors to this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking
 all other such Wills by me.
