thirty six (36) in the Eleventh district (11th Dist.)
Troup County State aforesaid. this I design for his
full share of my Estate.

3rd I give and bequeath to my son William one
hundred acres of land it being the other half lot
of the said number thirty six. this I design as his
full share of my Estate.

4th I give to my wife Annice the lot of land where
I now live number twenty nine in the Eleventh district
(11th Dist.) Troup, household kitchen furniture, plant
ation tools and all my stock, also a negro woman
named Silvy a negro girl named Winney and a
negro boy named Jim also all their increase to have the
full use and contrroll of during her natural life or
widowhood and after that I will the above named
property in this item to be equally divided between the
following children Nancy, Henry, Sarah, Annice
Elizur, Wiley, Mary Ann, Martha Caroline, Lesley
Jane, Emily Adeline and Hannah Pella before the
division of the above named property in fourth item
I will that Martha Caroline, Lesley Jane, Emily Adeline
and Hannah Pella have each a bed dressed and
furniture, one cow and calf, chest or trunk, one wheel
and card, also two head of sheep, one set plate,
one set cups and saucers, one pail and piggins, two
chairs which make the four last children equal to the
balance named in above item - My will is that my
entire Estate which I may possess at my death after
paying my just debts as above specified be equally
divided as above specified in above fourth item.

5th I do hereby appoint constitute and ordain my
wife Annice and my son Henry Executors and
Executor to carry this my last will and testament
into full effect this year of our Lord Eighteen hun
