 be authorized to do were I in life. I want this to be
 done without any administration or qualification of
 my said wife as executrix she being authorized by
 my will to proceed in the matter immediately after
 my death -

Item 3rd I nominate & appoint my said wife my executrix
 to this my will. In testimony whereof I have
 hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this
 November 12 1861.

Georgia, } In the name of God Amen, I, Mary R. Harris of the County and State aforesaid; being of sound and disposing mind, and memory; and of ordinary health of body; knowing the uncertainty of life and certainty of of death do make publick and and declare this my last will and testament revoking all other Wills which I may have made heretofore, in substance and form as follows

Item 1st I will my body to the grave to be interred at such place, and manner as shall best suite the taste and convenience of my beloved husband; and my sole to her who gave it knowing that he who doeth all things well will render to those of followers who shall continue faithful to the end a rich reward beyond the skies

Item 2nd It is my will that my beloved husband keep during his lifetime, the whole or any parts of my household or kitchen furniture; he may desire to have; I likewise give, and bequeath to him during his lifetime my negro man Rolie, woman Sarah, and at his death; I desire that the said negroes Rolie & Sarah and their increase shall be given to my sister Francis B. Douglass for her own proper behoof & benefit free from the claims or claims of any and every other persons forever in fee simple. I also will to my beloved husband during his lifetime my pleasure Carriage and at his death I desire that he shall give it to such of my relations as he may think proper I also give to him for ever my primers silver forks with my names none engraved upon them It is my will that my beloved husband shall have and Control the whole of my money or notes upon an note bearing after disposed of and that he shall pay the legal interest annually to my two neeces Low & Annny Maney and at the death of my husband it is my desire that the whole of the money and notes above mentioned shall be equally divided share and share alike between Low & Annny & Thomas children of my brother Matthew F. Mosely

Item 3rd To my sister Martha I give one thousand dollars and an equal share of my personal apparel with my sister Anna Douglass and an equal share of my home hold and kitchen furniture with my brother Matthew F. Mosely and my sister Francis B. Douglass share and share alike and I desire that my sisters Low & Douglass shall divide and and portion to each one his or her respective share

Item 4th To my sister Francis B. Douglass in addition to the legacy already given her in the 2nd and third Item of this will; I also give her one thousand dollars for her own proper use behoof & benefit free from the claim or claims of any and every other persons forever and my two girls never water
