

I John C Taylor of the County of Deup and State of Georgia in the year of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ One Thousand Eight hundred and Six do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following.

I give my wife Fabiula Taylor my entire Estate during her life land, negroes, stock household & Kitchen furniture plantation utensils & crop that may be on hand, and at death to be divided as follows.

I give to Robert B Taylor and John H Taylor the tract of land I still possessed of containing 400 acres more or less to be equally divided between them, to them and theirs forever.

I give unto Sarah A Oslin Isaac, Peggy, Frederie, Malinda his wife with all their increase from this date also James and at her death said property to be equally divided between her children by John Oslin said prospect kept by Robert B Taylor trustee for said J. A. Oslin and her children by J. Oslin.

I give unto Susan E Bradfield a woman named Malinda a girl named Nancy Cynthia and Jessie at her death said J. C. Bradfield to be divided as follows to Mary J Bradfield Malinda & Nancy to William R Bradfield a girl named Cynthia to him and his heirs.

I give to Sarah Denton Bradfield a girl named Jessie to her and her heirs.

I give to Mary J McDonald a girl named Susan and her increase also a bed & furniture to her and her heirs.

I give to Sarah Jane McDonald a girl named Sarah Ann and her increase also a bed & furniture to her and her heirs.

I give to John Collin McDonald a boy named Crockett a horse and saddle to him and his heirs.

I give Robert J McDonald a boy named Edmund horse and saddle to him and his heirs.

I give to Virginia B McDonald a girl named Cecilia bed and furniture to her and her heirs.

My wife is to pay my debts out of the property left her at her death my executors here after named shall sell all the stock household and kitchen furniture plantation utensils with all the crop that may be on hand and be divided as follows. One fourth to R. B. Taylor or son to Sarah Oslin's children by Culan McDonald dead agently between them one fourth to Susan E Bradfield's children Mary J Bradfield William R Bradfield Sarah Denton Bradfield to them and their heirs. One fourth to John H Taylor to him and his heirs. I appoint Robert B Taylor John H Taylor executors to this my last Will and Testament as witness whereof I have hereunto affixed my hand & seal in presence of the subscribers witnesses 21 May 1856 John C Taylor
