John W David's last will & Testament,

In the name of God, Amen.

I John W David of the County of Troup and State of Georgia being very sick and make but of sound mind and memory thank God given unto me calling unto mind the Mortality of my body & knowing it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last will & Testament. That is to say, principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul unto the hands of Almighty God that gave it, and my body I command to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial at the discretion of my executors, which I shall receive again by the mighty power of God. And as touching such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this life give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner & form -

I give to my dear wife Elizabeth J David during her natural life or widowhood all my property both real and personal with all my household goods, debts and movable effects. But in case my wife Elizabeth J David marrying again after my decease then my wife Elizabeth J. David shall be entitled to a child, part of the property and effects, as above mentioned. and it is my will further that when any or all of my lawful children shall become of age or marry shall then be entitled to an equal division of all the property -

It is my will further that the negro girl Clara and her child Jim be exchanged for a certain negro girl Louisa belonging to Willi Strickland of Madison County Georgia provided the said Willi Strickland will consent thereto by paying me John W David one hundred dollars. But in case the said Willi Strickland will not consent

to the change of property as proposed in
this item then it is my will that the said
girl Clara be sold by my Executor -

It is my will further that should any
property be coming from my own relations by
consanguinity all to go to my lawful chil-
-dren and should any property be coming
from the relations of my wife Elizabeth D.
David all to be retained and possessed
by her to be disposed of in any way she
desires,

It is further my will that Luke Johnson
of Troup County, and William W. Power of
Madison County Ga. act as executors to this
my last will and testament,
